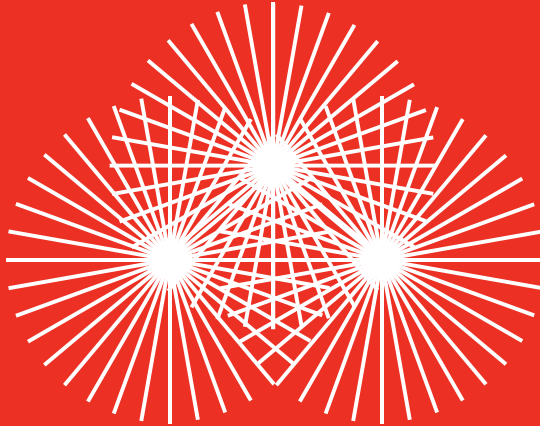

### CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES

**The following conditions will strictly apply:**

- All entry forms, whether lodged in person or sent by post, or completed on-line must be in the Society's possession at its Administration Office by 5.00 pm on Friday, 28 May 2010.
- Postal entry forms and fees will be accepted up to and including entries postmarked on or before the official closing date.
- A late entry option is offered under the following conditions:  
Received or postmarked within 7 days of the official closing date; *and* an additional fee equivalent to three times the standard entry fee per class is to be paid.
- **Late Entry option is not available on-line.**
- When sending entry forms and fees by post, the onus is on the exhibitor to ensure adequate delivery time.
- Entry forms by facsimile will not be accepted.
- If you require formal acknowledgement that your entry has been received, please include a stamped, self-addressed envelope with your entry form.
- **Absolutely no exception to the above conditions will be made to any exhibitor under any circumstance.**

### ENTRY FEES (GST INCLUDED)

Members of the RA&HS, \$15 per entry;  
non-members, \$20 per entry.

### MEMBERSHIP

Exhibitors need not be members of the Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Society of SA Inc, but members are entitled to a reduced entry fee. Membership fees: Adults \$125, Juniors (under 18) as at 1 January 2010, \$42

### PAYMENT OF FEES

When paying fees by cheque or credit card, exhibitors must ensure that sufficient funds are available at the time of entry. Failure to do so may result in non-acceptance of entries.

### SPECIAL REGULATIONS

Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show and that the Special Regulations, hereunder set out, which apply to this section only, are merely supplementary to these General Regulations. A copy of the General Regulations may be obtained from the Society's website ([www.theshow.com.au](http://www.theshow.com.au)) or upon request from the Society's Administration Office.

### PRIZES AND AWARDS

A first prize of \$40 or more will be awarded in each class unless no entry is of sufficient quality. All entries gaining 94 points or more will receive gold medal awards and those gaining 93 or 93.5 points will receive silver medal awards. RA&HS sashes will be awarded to all champion winners

### PRIZE MONEY

Exhibitors may request any prize money won during the Royal Adelaide Show be paid by EFT (Electronic Funds Transfer) by completing the form provided. EFT is a more efficient payment method. Exhibitors not requesting payment by EFT will be paid by cheque at the end of October, 2010.

### SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES

Exhibitors are permitted to make no more than 5 entries per class. Exhibits must be manufactured in Australia by the exhibitor. In classes 1-53, exhibits must be manufactured with Bovine Milk, (excluding classes 19, 24 and 52 for Non-Bovine Milk.

**In all Classes except Best Innovative Dairy Product, entries shall consist of 1 or more retail units aggregating between 500 grams or millilitres and approximately 2kgs or litres in quantity.**

1. Amendment to the Entry requirements: All exhibits (Class 1-53) shall comply with the relevant requirements of Food Standards 4.2.4, 1.6.2 and 2.5.4 of the FSANZ Food Standards Code.
2. All entry forms from Dairy Processor companies entering the South Australian Dairy Awards Dairy product (Classes 1-53) are required to provide information of which state Dairy Authority or Relevant State Dairy Regulator they are accredited with to meet national food safety compliance.

### GRAND DAIRY AWARDS

Products in classes 1-51 (excluding those manufactured from non bovine milk) awarded a gold medal are eligible for entry into the Grand Dairy Awards.

## 2 DAIRY PRODUCTS

### SUPPLY OF EXHIBITS

All exhibits will remain the property of the RA&HS. The winner of the Champion Cheese may be requested to supply a quantity of the winning product for use for judging and industry tastings during the Royal Adelaide Wine Show. The Society requests that this product is provided at wholesale price or less. Acknowledgement of supply will be made during these events.

### YOUR PRIVACY

If you do not want your details to be made available to other parties, please tick the box on the entry form supplied by the RA&HS. Your personal information will only be used by the RA&HS to maintain contact with you and allow us to manage your entries. The RA&HS reserves the right to inform prize sponsors the details of recipients to enable distribution of their voucher/product prizes to the winner. Please note: By ticking the box to suppress your details, your name and address will not appear in the Catalogue (if applicable).

### LABELLING OF EXHIBITS (ALL CLASSES)

The outside of each container, package etc in which any exhibit or exhibits are delivered or consigned for judging shall bear a label clearly identifying the class number(s) and entry number(s) of each exhibit contained therein. Each individual exhibit shall have attached or adjacent to it the label supplied by this Society, setting out the class number and exhibit number. Any exhibit not clearly identified shall be disqualified by the stewards prior to judging. For uniformity in presenting exhibits to the judges the Society's labels shall be left on or adjacent to each exhibit.

### DUMMIES

During the Show a display will feature prize winning produce and trophies. As this will be unrefrigerated, it is required that dummy packs, bearing normal retail brands, be provided. These should represent the product as it is normally marketed to the public.

Exhibitors may be required to provide a selection of dummies for special displays featuring championship winners. The display will be located in the Dairy Foods Hall, Milk Bar, Western end of Kingsway.

### PRIZE MONEY AND GST

Prize money as stated in the Prize Schedule does not include GST.

The prize money which we pay to successful exhibitors depends on information provided to us.

If you confirm that you are GST registered and provide your Australian Business Number, we will pay the appropriate prize money plus 10% GST. We will provide to you a Recipient Created Tax Invoice detailing the GST which you will need to submit to the Australian Tax Office.

In entering the competition, you acknowledge your agreement to the following:

- You will not issue a tax invoice to the RA&HS in respect to prize money received;
- You will notify the RA&HS if you cease to be registered for GST.

If you provide your Australian Business Number but are not registered for GST, we will pay the prize money as detailed in the Prize Schedule without reference to GST.

If you confirm that you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, we will pay the prize money as detailed in the Prize Schedule without reference to GST.

### IMPORTANT

It is important that you either:

- confirm that you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, or
  - provide your Australian Business Number.
- There is a specific area on the entry form to allow you to do this.

**Failure to do either of the above will cause the RA&HS to withhold 48.5% of your prize money in accordance with Australian Tax legislation.**

The RA&HS is not a tax consultant and therefore assumes no liability for actions taken as a result of these guidelines. In any instances where an entrant or a sponsor is uncertain of the tax implications of their involvement, they should consult their own accountant or tax adviser.

### JUDGING

The Judges may request the Society to have tests done on any entry suspected of not complying with class conditions or the Food Standards Code. At least 2 Judges and 2 Stewards must attend the judging unless the attendance of fewer personnel is approved by the Dairy Products Committee.

Results of these competitions will be released to the media on 10 August 2010. No prior publicity or advertising is permitted.

### CHEDDAR CHEESE

Exhibits are required to have flavour profiles consistent with the terms "mild", "matured" etc for each class. A maximum of 5kg of product to be supplied.

Exhibits not complying will be penalised or disqualified.

#### Class 1—THE SWIRE COLD STORAGE PRIZE Cheese, cheddar, rindless, mild

### NAMED NON-CHEDDAR CHEESE

Exhibits in classes 6 - 14 shall be natural cheese only; no added ingredients shall be permitted other than those added during primary manufacture (e.g. peppers in Pepato).

Exhibits must be given a recognised varietal name or appropriate description, provided the exhibitor's identity is not disclosed.

All entries shall be at least 500g samples.

#### Class 6—Cheese, very hard, grating.

#### Class 7—Cheese, hard or semi-hard, bacteria ripened, with or without eyes.

- Including varieties using an exterior "smear" for a minor ripening function.

**Class 53–THE DAIRY AUSTRALIA PRIZE  
Best Innovative Dairy Product.**

1. Exhibits must be in the hands of the Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Society of South Australia Inc, PO Box 40, Goodwood, SA 5034, by 30 June 2010
  2. Each exhibit must relate to a product which is actually being marketed, and has been introduced into the Australian market, within the twelve months preceding the opening day of the Show. It need not be a consumer product; it can be an ingredient or a non-food application. The product itself is not required to be submitted, but may also be entered in another class within the prize schedule.
  3. Each exhibit must be in the form of a one or two page statement and may be accompanied by specimens of labels or packages. The statement must describe the product, giving all compositional and nutritional information except any matter of a confidential nature. Other information should include the intended uses of the product, especially where it is not a consumer item, its benefits to the dairy industry in general, and major reasons for its development, such as results of market research or perceived needs of the industry or consumers. In giving the above information, innovations of any kind should be highlighted.

## CHOCOLATES

Entries are restricted to four per class from each exhibitor.

Exhibits must be manufactured in Australia by the exhibitor.

Exhibitors must be commercial manufacturers of chocolate.

All exhibits must be manufactured with Bovine milk (excluding dark chocolate).

Note: For consumer packs, the presentation of the pack will also be taken into consideration under Presentation.

All entries should comply with the appropriate provisions of the Australian Food Standards Code (which specifies minimum milk contents for milk chocolate).

The dairy components should be of Australian origin.

Entries will be accepted only from the original manufacturer of the entry. They will not be accepted from wholesalers, retailers or others.

As judging places emphasis on the product rather than the pack, entries of the same product will not be accepted in more than one packaging type.

Judges reserve the right to purchase commercial samples and compare same to exhibits, any significant variation may result in disqualification or downgrading of points.

All entries should be as per a normal production run. Chocolate/Compound - all entries are limited to chocolate as defined in the Australian Food Standards Codes i.e. compound chocolate and products made with compounded chocolate will not be accepted.

### PRIZES & AWARDS

A first prize of \$40 or more will be awarded in each class unless no entry is of sufficient quality. Gold Medals will be awarded to exhibits achieving between 91-100 points and Silver for 81-90 points.

**Class 54–Chocolate, Milk**, unbranded block of minimum 200 grams.

Actual chocolate used must have been manufactured by the exhibitor.

◆ First \$40.

**Class 55–Chocolate, Dark**, unbranded block of minimum 200 grams.

Actual chocolate used must have been manufactured by the exhibitor.

◆ First \$40.

**Class 56–Panned Chocolates**, any flavour of chocolate, any variety, minimum exhibit 200 grams.

**Class 57–Chocolate Bars**, coated or filled, minimum of four samples to be submitted.

**Class 58–Chocolate Truffles**, ganache based, 200 grams sample.

**Class 59–Boxed Chocolate**, single variety, excluding mint and ginger, two boxes to be submitted.
