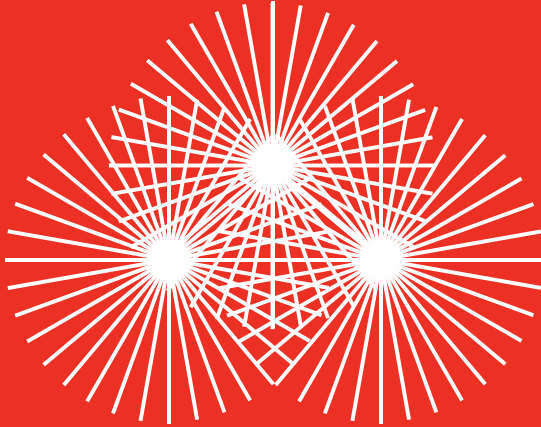

# SOUTH AUSTRALIAN ALPACA BREED & FLEECE CHAMPIONSHIPS

## ARRIVAL

Alpacas must arrive and be penned between  
**12.00 noon and 2.00 pm on Thursday, 2 September.**

Exhibitors will be required to remove their vehicles from the Showground immediately after animals have been unloaded and penned. Alpacas not in their allotted pens by the specified arrival time may be disqualified by the Chief Steward.

## ENTRY GATE

Alpacas will enter through the Leader Street Gate.

## INSPECTION OF EXHIBITS

The Society shall, appoint a person or persons as an inspector or inspectors who shall then examine all Alpacas for eligibility and correctness. The inspection of all Alpacas will be carried out between 2.00 pm and 4.00 pm on Thursday, 2 September.

**ALPACAS NOT IN THEIR ALLOTTED PENS AT THE TIME OF THE OFFICIAL INSPECTION MAY BE DISQUALIFIED BY THE CHIEF STEWARD.**

Any decision or determination of disqualification is entirely within the discretion of the Chief Steward and shall not be challenged or called into question in any proceedings or in any manner whatsoever. The Inspector or Chief Steward will classify all entries for colour and has the power to transfer an exhibit to the class in which, in his/her opinion, it should have been entered. The Chief Steward may combine or split classes as he/she sees fit in consultation with the Supervisor.

Exhibits must carry a minimum fleece length of 50mm for Huacayas and 75mm for Suris. Huacaya 12 months and older must be shorn regularly so that no more than 15 months fleece is carried at the time of showing. Suri should carry no more than 24 months fleece.

## JUDGING

Alpaca (**Suri sections will be judged first**) ..... from 9.30 am, Friday, 3 September  
Production Classes ..... from 9.00 am, Saturday, 4 September  
Junior Handler Classes.....  
(*will be judged after the Sires Progeny Class*)..... from approx. 4.00 pm, Saturday, 4 September

The animals must not be moved from their allotted pen whilst judging is in progress except by the order of the Chief Steward.

## DEPARTURE

Alpacas must leave the Showground between  
**4.00 pm and 6.00 pm on Monday, 6 September.**

Interstate exhibitors may leave up to 24 hours earlier at the Supervisor's discretion.

## PAVILION

Alpacas will be housed in the Alpaca & Goat Pavilion on the Western Boundary of the Showground (immediately north of the Sheep Pavilion)

## CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES

### CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES

The following conditions will strictly apply:

- All entry forms, whether lodged in person or sent by post, or completed on-line must be in the Society's possession at its Administration Office by 5.00 pm on Friday, 16 July 2010.
- Postal entry forms and fees will be accepted up to and including entries postmarked on or before the official closing date.
- A late entry option is offered under the following conditions:  
Received or postmarked within 7 days of the official closing date *and* an additional fee equivalent to three times the standard entry fee per class is to be paid.
- When sending entry forms and fees by post, the onus is on the exhibitor to ensure adequate delivery time.
- Entry forms by facsimile will not be accepted.
- If you require formal acknowledgement that your entry has been received, please include a stamped, self-addressed envelope with your entry form.
- **Absolutely no exception to the above conditions will be made to any exhibitor under any circumstance.**

### ENTRY FEES

The fee for each entry (GST included) is \$25 (unless otherwise stated). One free catalogue per exhibitor is included.

### MEMBERSHIP

Exhibitors of alpacas must be members of the RA&HS except exhibitors of fleeces only, exhibitors of alpacas in production classes only or junior handlers.

Membership fees: Adults \$125, Juniors (under 18) as at 1 January 2010, \$42.

### WITHDRAWALS

All withdrawals must be made in writing and can be sent via email to: [info@adelaideshowground.com.au](mailto:info@adelaideshowground.com.au) or faxed to (08) 8212 1533. Emailed withdrawals must include "Withdrawal" in the subject line and the section (eg Alpaca Section), exhibitor name, class number, exhibit number (if known) and exhibit name (if applicable). Withdrawals must be made at least 24 hours prior to judging.

### PAYMENT OF FEES

When paying fees by cheque or credit card, exhibitors must ensure that sufficient funds are available at the time of entry. Failure to do so may result in non-acceptance of entries.

### SPECIAL REGULATIONS

Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show and that the Special Regulations hereunder set out, which apply to this section only, are merely supplementary to and subject to the Regulations.

A copy of the General Regulations may be obtained from the Society's website at [www.theshow.com.au](http://www.theshow.com.au) or a copy may be obtained upon request from the Society's Administration Office. This Show will be based upon many of the Australian Alpaca Association Showing Rules (July 2009).

### PRIZES

Prizes in each class will be:

First, \$15, ribbon and card; second, \$10, ribbon and card; third, \$5, ribbon and card.

RA&HS sashes will be awarded to all Huacaya and Suri Champions, Reserve Champions, Best Wether (Huacaya), Best Fancy Alpaca (Huacaya), Champion Colours (Huacaya classes), Most Successful New Exhibitor, Best Opposite Sex (Suri), Best Composite Appraisal Exhibit, Owner of Winning Huacaya Sire and Owner of Winning Suri Sire (Sires Progeny Classes).

### PRIZE MONEY

Exhibitors may request any prize money won during the Royal Adelaide Show be paid by EFT (Electronic Funds Transfer) by completing the form provided. EFT is a more efficient payment method and prize money will be paid earlier than payments made by cheque.

Exhibitors not requesting payment by EFT will be paid by cheque at the end of October 2010.

### PRIZE MONEY AND GST

Prize money as stated in the Prize Schedule does not include GST. The prize money which we pay to successful exhibitors depends on information provided to us.

If you confirm that you are GST registered and provide your Australian Business Number, we will pay the appropriate prize money plus 10% GST. We will provide to you a Recipient Created Tax Invoice detailing the GST which you will need to submit to the Australian Tax Office.

In entering the competition, you acknowledge your agreement to the following:

- You will not issue a tax invoice to the RA&HS in respect to prize money received;
- You will notify the RA&HS if you cease to be registered for GST.

If you provide your Australian Business Number but are not registered for GST, we will pay the prize money as detailed in the Prize Schedule without reference to GST.

If you confirm that you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, we will pay the prize money as detailed in the Prize Schedule without reference to GST.

#### IMPORTANT

It is important that you either:

- confirm that you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, or
- provide your Australian Business Number.

There is a specific area on the entry form to allow you to do this.

**Failure to do either of the above will cause the RA&HS to withhold 48.5% of your prize money in accordance with Australian Tax legislation.**

The RA&HS is not a tax consultant and therefore assumes no liability for actions taken as a result of these guidelines. In any instances where an entrant or sponsor is uncertain of the tax implications of their involvement, they should consult their own accountant or tax advisor.

#### YOUR PRIVACY

If you do not want your details to be made available to other parties, please tick the box on the entry form supplied by the RA&HS. Your personal information will only be used by the RA&HS to maintain contact with you and allow us to manage your entries. The RA&HS reserves the right to inform prize sponsors the details of recipients to enable distribution of their voucher/product prizes to the winner. Please note: By ticking the box to suppress your details, your name and address will not appear in the Catalogue (if applicable).

#### REGISTRATION

At the time of entry all Alpacas entered (other than wethers and alpacas in Junior Handler classes) must be registered with a recognised organisation and, at the time of penning, must carry approved identification. All alpacas must be entered and shown in the name of the registered owner or leasee.

A copy of the Registration Certificate (both sides) for each exhibit or a copy of the current 'AAA Alpaca Animal Details' for each exhibit, must be included when entry forms are lodged, except for unregistered wethers and alpacas in Junior Handler classes.

An original copy of the Registration Certificate for each exhibit must be available to inspectors if requested (unregistered wethers and alpacas in Junior Handler classes are excluded).

#### PHYSICAL SOUNDNESS & DISAPPROVED EXHIBITS

All male animals must be completely entire and deemed physically sound. Any male not deemed completely entire (other than a wether) shall not compete. Any marks of spaying on females shall disqualify them from competing.

All wethers must be physically sound and must have been castrated. Any wether entry may be either a registered or unregistered Alpaca.

All animals exhibited must be of a satisfactory standard, be in reasonable show condition and be given proper attention during the Show.

Any exhibit, disapproved of for exhibition by the Inspector or Chief Steward, must upon notice to that effect, be removed from the Showground.

#### PROTESTS

An exhibitor may lodge a protest against another exhibitor or a Show Official. The sole grounds of a protest shall be a breach of the Show rules. Subject to the General Regulations, protests shall be addressed to the Director and be lodged at his office on the Showground before 6.00 pm on the day the decision in question has been made. Such protests shall be accompanied by a deposit of \$20 which may be forfeited to the Society if in the sole opinion of the Chief Steward the protest is unfounded, frivolous or vexatious.

The protest and all matters arising therefrom shall be determined conclusively as to all matters by the Society and shall not be the subject of any appeal to any court.

#### PEN CLEANING

Exhibitors shall, to the satisfaction of the Alpaca Supervisor:

1. Keep each pen allotted to them and their Alpacas in a clean and proper condition throughout the Show.
2. Cleaning of pens is to be completed before 8.00 am each day. Pens may not be cleaned out at any other times.
3. Wastewater must not be emptied in the goat wash down sinks.

#### HEALTH REGULATIONS

All exhibitors must complete an "Alpaca and Llama Herd Health Status Declaration for Shows and Sales" endorsed by an Inspector (obtained at [www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/programs/id](http://www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/programs/id)) and return with your Royal Adelaide Show entry documents.

Interstate exhibitors must complete a "SA Alpaca Movement and Health Declaration" Form and this form travels with the Alpaca to the Show. Exhibitors requiring interstate stock clearances and documents are advised to contact Amelia Bartlett, PIRSA Animal Health Officer on 08 8535 6405.

#### JOHNE'S DISEASE

The minimum requirement for entry of Alpacas to the Royal Adelaide Show is **Q Alpaca**, or MN1 in the Alpaca Market Assurance Program.

#### HORMONAL GROWTH PROMOTANTS

As stipulated in the Society's general Regulations - Prohibited Drugs, Alpacas which have been treated with hormones are not eligible for entry or exhibition at the Royal Adelaide Show. Entries not meeting the health requirements as set out and/or entries with incomplete health documentation, will not be accepted.

#### AGE AND DATE OF BIRTH

1 September, 2010 is the reference date for the calculation of age of an animal for the purposes of entering age classes at the Royal Adelaide Show.

The following table shows the birth dates between which animals must have been born in order to be eligible for each age class.

##### 6 months and under 12 months

2/9/09 to 1/3/10

##### 12 months and under 18 months

2/3/09 to 1/9/09

##### 18 months and under 30 months

2/3/08 to 1/3/09

##### 30 months and under 48 months

2/9/06 to 1/3/08

##### 48 months and over

born on or before 1/9/06

#### RESTRICTIONS OF ENTRIES

In the event of more entries being received than can be comfortably accommodated, and in order to encourage greater exhibitor numbers, the Society reserves the right to reduce the number of alpacas entered by any exhibitor to a figure determined by the Society. The exhibitor will have the right to nominate the alpacas to be withdrawn.

#### PENALTY FOR NON-EXHIBITION OF ANIMALS

Every animal entered must be exhibited unless a certificate signed by the exhibitor is lodged with the Society at least 14 days before the opening day of the Show, stating that the animal is unable to compete for one of the following reasons:

1. the animal has died,
2. the animal is unfit for exhibition due to injury or disease,
3. the animal has become ineligible for the class entered,
4. some other cause which the Society considers reasonable.

Any later scratchings must also be notified either by a statutory declaration signed by the exhibitor or a certificate signed by the exhibitor, together with an explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon. Exhibitors who do not comply with this rule will be fined \$100 for each animal not exhibited.

#### DRESS CODE

Handlers and all stewards appearing in or near the arena must wear white dustcoats over black pants and covered shoes. Juniors must have long trousers (moleskins or school trousers accepted) with covered shoes.

**NO denim jeans, shorts or sneakers permitted.**

Stewards assisting inside the pavilion must be smartly dressed - no jeans or sneakers. White dustcoats should be worn by handlers in the Grand Parade.

#### BEDDING

A straw allocation will be supplied for bedding for Alpacas at this year's Royal Adelaide Show. Additional straw may be purchased from the Shed Supervisor.

#### PARADES

All award winning Alpacas are expected to be paraded in any Grand Parade conducted during the stay of Alpacas at the Showground. Parading of all exhibits is encouraged. Penalties may be imposed upon exhibitors who do not participate.

#### EXHIBITOR'S PASSES

Exhibitors will be allocated one pass for each 4 head brought onto the Showground.

#### EXERCISING OF ALPACAS

Exercising of Alpacas will only be permitted during the times set and within designated areas. (Details to be provided with the Notice to Exhibitors).

#### FIRE PRECAUTIONS

Precautions will be taken to guard against fire, and to protect the property at the Show, but exhibits will not be insured at the cost of the Society. Smoking is strictly prohibited in all livestock pavilions and lockers.

No exhibitor or other person shall remove, or displace, or interfere in any way with, or use for any purpose other than the prevention of fire, any article or appliance provided for use in the case of an outbreak of fire upon the Showground, nor shall any exhibitor or other person remove or alter, or add to, or interfere in any way with any fixture, fitting, article, appliance or thing owned by the Society, or used in such fixture, fitting, article, appliance or thing for any purpose other than for which it is intended by the Society to be used. The consumption of intoxicating liquor in all pavilions, halls and attendants' lockers is forbidden.

#### SICK OR DISEASED ANIMALS

If, in the opinion of a qualified Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the Society, an animal on the Showground shall be injured or be so affected by sickness, disease or other ailment as to warrant its destruction or its removal from the Showground as the case may be, the Society shall be entitled to have the animal destroyed and/

or require the animal to be forthwith removed from the Showground and the exhibitor, upon receipt of such notice, shall forthwith remove such animal and failing such removal by him/her within the time prescribed by the Society, by written notice to the exhibitor or his/her representative on the Showground, the Society may remove the animal or cause the animal to be removed and all costs and expenses of removal shall be borne by the exhibitor, and shall be refunded to the Society.

Each such animal shall at all times be the sole risk and responsibility of the exhibitor and the person or persons removing the animal shall at all times be deemed to be agents of the exhibitor and all acts and omissions on the part of such person or persons shall be deemed to be acts and omissions of the exhibitor who shall indemnify and hold indemnified the Society, its servants and agents from all claims whatsoever in respect of the animal whether by reason of any loss or injury to or caused by the animal or because of transportation, feeding or housing or otherwise howsoever.

The pavilion supervisor must be advised immediately of any sick or diseased animals attended to by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon.

#### DISPLAY CARDS

Each stud is permitted to display one sign for every four pens occupied by exhibits, no larger than 1200 mm x 600 mm. Logo, name and address of stud only to be shown.

Strictly no other decoration, delineation, description, display or promotion is allowed.

Ribbons and sashes on display must relate to the alpaca/s in that pen. All awards must be removed as soon as winning alpacas leave the showground.

#### MOST SUCCESSFUL NEW EXHIBITOR

Open to any exhibitor showing for the first time in the Suri and/or Huacaya and/or Production and/or the Fleece Section/s of the 2009 Royal Adelaide Show.

A sliding scale of points, reflecting the level of any award, will be used. The exhibitor with the highest points score shall be the winner. Should a tie occur the number of entries by the tied exhibitors may be considered to determine the winner.

#### COMPANION ALPACAS, CRIA AT FOOT, BOTTLE FED BABIES

Cria at foot may be brought onto the Showground only with the permission of the Supervisor. No other companion alpacas are permitted.

#### SIRE'S PROGENY (HUACAYA AND SURI)

No entry fee for Progeny Classes

To qualify for the Sire's progeny Classes (Huacaya and Suri) the names and details of the sire/s must be stated on the entry form and submitted by closing date of entries. This enables each sire to be allocated an exhibit number.

Sire's eligible for judging will be determined after the inspection process has been completed, with scratching/s without penalty) as necessary. The Alpaca Supervisor will advise final line-up prior to the start of Friday's judging.

The following conditions apply:

Three progeny by one sire.

- Group of three males and/or females (not wethers), six months and over.
- Not necessarily owned and bred by the one exhibitor.
- All the progeny of one sire.
- A sire may be nominated more than once.
- Exhibits for the progeny groups must be drawn from general classes.

#### PRODUCTION CLASSES

Exhibitors entering alpacas in the Production classes only are not required to be members of the RA&HS. Normal entry requirements must be met including Health requirements.

**Production Classes (ie Composite Appraisal Classes and Wether Classes) will be judged on Saturday, 4 September commencing at 9.00 am.**

#### COMPOSITE APPRAISAL SECTION

The entry fee for the Composite Appraisal Classes is \$25 per entry. This includes a shearing cost of \$10 per entry which the Society will forward to the Shearing Team at the conclusion of the Show.

The Composite Appraisal Classes are designed to encourage the overall evaluation of an alpaca and the fleece it produces. Owners of alpacas bred primarily for commercial purposes are encouraged to participate in this section.

Alpacas entered in the normal age and colour competitive sections **may not** also be entered in Appraisal Classes.

There will be 3 judging components comprising:

- An appraisal of each alpaca based upon similar lines to normal judging.
- Each alpaca shall then be shorn and each fleece appraised along similar lines to normal fleece judging.
- Each alpaca will then be re-assessed once shorn.

Final awards will be made based upon the combined outcomes of the 3 judging components. For 2010, the Composite Appraisal Section is for Huacaya only.

#### WETHER CLASSES

The entry fee for Wether Classes is \$15 per entry. Wethers do not have to be registered with an Association but must carry appropriate identification (eg NLIS tag).

#### JUNIOR HANDLER CLASSES

The Entry Fee for Junior Handler Classes is \$5 per entry

The Junior Handler Section encourages young people between 6 and 15 years of age to participate and be part of South Australia's Royal Adelaide Show.

Entries for the Junior Handler Section should be completed by a parent or person responsible for the Handler and acting as the contact person. Alpaca details should be shown and the name and age of the Junior Handler should be written underneath these details. Entries must be received by the Society by the 16 July 2010.

NB. A **competitor** in the Junior Handler Section does not have to be a member of the Society if this is the only Class entered.

**Alpacas** entered in the Junior Handler Section do not have to be registered with an Association, but must comply with all other conditions including health regulations.

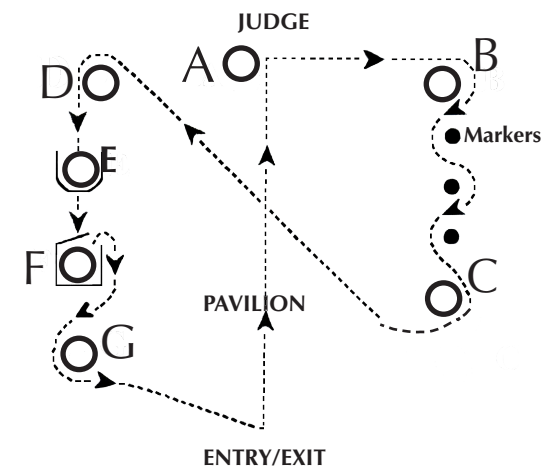

Halt and acknowledge Judge. ....10
  - 2 Advance to (B). Turn right and walk alpaca backwards through markers to (C).....15
  - 3 Turn right at (C). Advance diagonally to (D) with loose lead. ....15
  - 4 Turn left and go through or around an obstacle. ....15
  - 5 Advance to pen. Open gate with assistance from Steward. Enter pen, remove halter and re-fit. ....15
  - 6 Leave pen and advance to (G). ....5
  - 7 Overall dress and presence.....5
  - 8 Overall presentation of alpaca.....5
  - 9 Confidence and teamwork between handler and alpaca.....5
  - 10 Verbal response to questions from Judge....10
- Total .....100**

Owners of well-conformed wethers carrying good quality fleece which is suitable for commercial purposes are encouraged to support these classes. They are particularly suitable to new owners and schools, and offer another opportunity for Juniors.

#### JUDGING

Handlers should wear a white coat over trousers, a neat top and closed shoes. They will be asked to walk their alpaca through a designated course and will be required to remove and refit the halter. They may be asked up as three questions by the Judge. Points will be awarded according to

**All exhibitors are reminded of their obligation to ensure all animals are adequately fed, have access to fresh water and pens are kept clean.**

## CRITERIA FOR ALPACAS ON DISPLAY FOR THE SECOND HALF OF THE SHOW

(Amended November 2009 following discussion at post-show Diverse Farming Meeting)

### Aim

To have approximately 50 alpacas present after the departure of alpacas in the Competitive Section.

### Criteria

- **The same rules and regulations outlined in the Alpaca Schedule, including ownership, apply for all alpacas on display during the second half of the Show. Proof of ownership and animal ID must be provided for each alpaca to the satisfaction of the Alpaca Supervisor (eg IAR tag, Registration Certificate, PIC tag with animal ID). Alpacas may be registered or unregistered.**
- The same health standards and rules apply **during** the second half of the show (see Alpaca Show Schedule).
- Normal shed rules apply (eg cleaning, exercising, signage).
- No alpacas under six month of age, or bottle fed cria, will be permitted.
- First preference **will** be given to those showing and those assisting during the first half of the Show (ie exhibitors, stewards, official volunteers). If space permits other breeders and owners may participate.
- Owners may negotiate, through the Alpaca Supervisor, to swap over alpacas. Additional Health and Movement documentation must be completed.

### Advertising and Signage

- The Alpaca Pavilion is a competitive and display venue, not a commercial site. The second half of the show presents an opportunity to have alpacas on display with owners present to interact with the public and further promote the industry.
- Display cards should be consistent with those permitted in the first half of the show, ie no larger than 1200 mm x 600 mm with logo, name and contact details shown.
- No "For Sale" signage or hand-outs listing alpacas for sale are permitted.
- Fact Sheets, posters, and other general educational material promoting alpacas are permitted.
- Business Cards are permitted, but strictly no persuasion, coercion, or selling is allowed from the Venue.

<b>Amount of Cover:</b>	\$10,000,000 any one occurrence
<b>Deductible:</b>	\$10,000 any one occurrence
<b>Geographic Limits:</b>	At and from the event venue
<b>Claims Payable:</b>	Worldwide excluding claims made USA and Canada

#### Important Conditions:

1. The Insured Party must exercise reasonable care to maintain all premises, fittings and plant in sound condition.
2. The Insured Party must take all reasonable precautions to prevent injury and damage to persons and property.

## RISK MANAGEMENT HAZARD REPORTING

Entry to and remaining on the Showground is entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor and to the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor releases the Society (which term includes in this clause the Society's officers, employees, members and agents), from all claims and demands of every kind resulting from any accident, damage or injury occurring at the Showground, and without limitation, the Exhibitor acknowledges:
  - (a) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any Exhibit;
  - (b) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees and Agents;
  - (c) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to a Motor Vehicle or any of its contents whilst it is located on the Showground; and
  - (d) without limiting Regulations 1 (a) and 1 (b) above, the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury resulting from the sale, treatment, failure to treat, destruction, disposal or other dealing with any Exhibit, or for loss, damage or injury to any personal belongings, equipment or property brought onto the Showground.
2. Indemnity  
To the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor must indemnify and keep indemnified the Society and its officers, employees, members and agents from and against all actions, claims, demands, losses, damages, costs, expenses and liabilities including without limitation, consequential loss and loss of profits for which the Society is or may be or become liable in respect of or arising from:
  - (a) loss, damage or injury to any person in connection with the Exhibit or the relevant Event;
  - (b) without limiting Regulation 2(a), loss, damage or injury to any other Exhibit or Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees, Agents, or to the property of the Society, or its members, or to the general public, caused or contributed to or by any act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents; and

## COMPETITIVE EXHIBITORS

### Conditions of Entry

- (c) without limiting Regulation 2(a), loss, damage or injury to the Exhibit, or the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees, or Agents caused or contributed by an act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the transportation, feeding or housing of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor.
3. Removal from Showground  
Without prejudice to any other provision in these Regulations, where the Society, its officers, employees, members or agents removes an Exhibit, or causes an Exhibit to be removed from the Showground, the Exhibit is removed or caused to be removed entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor. The person or persons removing the Exhibit will be deemed to be the agent of the Exhibitor, and his or her acts and omissions will be deemed to be the acts and omissions of the Exhibitor.
4. Insurance  
The Society will arrange Compulsory Owner's Liability insurance cover for all Exhibitors of Exhibits being animals. The Exhibitor is bound by the terms and conditions of this insurance and by Statutory Duties as defined under the Insurance Contracts Act (1984). Details of the Compulsory Owner's Liability insurance are set out in the Relevant Schedule
5. Personal effects  
The Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss or damage caused to personal belongings, equipment or property which is brought onto the Showground by an Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents.

#### EMERGENCY INFORMATION

Emergency information and Emergency Assembly Points for the various animal pavilions and stables will be included with Exhibitor Entry Detail Returns and Notice to Exhibitor mail outs. Competitors should be familiar with these plans.

#### FIRST AID

During the Royal Adelaide Show, St John Ambulance provides First Aid Services but it is suggested that competitors have a basic First Aid kit if minor injuries are a possibility.

#### RA&HS EMERGENCY FACILITIES

Fire fighting and other emergency equipment must not be removed or used for any other purpose. Missing or unserviceable equipment should be reported to the Venue Management Office immediately.

#### SMOKING

The RA&HS Smoking Code does not permit smoking inside buildings, within 10 metres of a building entrance, around combustibles, during public performances or while handling hazardous materials.

#### TRAFFIC CONTROL

The RA&HS Traffic Control Code imposes speed restrictions within the Showground. For the duration of the Royal Adelaide Show the speed limit is 10 kph. The use of vehicles inside the Showground is closely managed during the Royal Adelaide Show. Conditions of entry will be provided with the issue of Vehicle Entry Permits.

#### ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

1. Competitors should supply their own "Safety Switch" (RCD) for installation at each power outlet they use.
2. Extension cords must be earthed and all electrical appliances must be earthed or double insulated. Appliances must be in sound working order and safety tagged.
3. Power boards with overload protection can only be used at the discretion of the Venue Services Manager.
4. The use of double adaptors is strictly prohibited.
5. Appliances and power cables must not be used or laid through any area that may become wet.
6. Power cables must not be laid across walkways, paths, roads or any area where damage could occur to the cable.
7. Bar (resistance) heaters must not be used.
8. Light sockets must not be used for any other purpose than for lighting.
