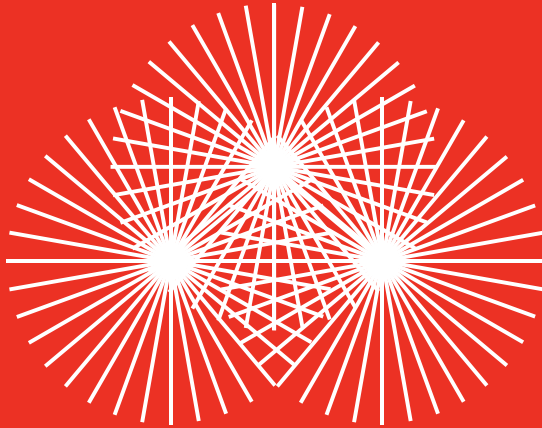

# GOATS

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION

### ARRIVAL TIMES

#### Mohair

All fleeces must be delivered to the Administration Office, Adelaide Showground, Wayville no later than 12.00 noon on Wednesday, 11 August 2010. Fleeces sent by courier must be addressed to RA&HS, Adelaide Showground, Wayville and be clearly marked "MOHAIR". Do not include skirtings with fleeces

#### Dairy Goats

To arrive ready for inspection by 4.00 pm on Thursday, 3 September. Entries in Class 16 must arrive by 4.00 pm on Wednesday, 1 September

#### Angora and Boer Goats

To arrive between 1.00 pm and 4.00 pm on Tuesday, 7 September.

Angora goats for School Appraisal classes to arrive by 12.00 noon on Tuesday, 7 September

#### Led Goat Wether

Led Wethers to arrive between 8.00 pm on Tuesday, 7 September and 8.00 am on Wednesday, 8 September.

### ENTRY GATE

All goats to enter and leave by the Leader Street Gate.

### DEPARTURE TIMES

#### Dairy Goats

Dairy Goat exhibitors have the option of leaving the Showground on Monday, 6 September from 4.00 pm or remain for the duration of the Show, in which case they may leave the Showground on Saturday, 11 September from 4.00 pm  
Exit permits to be lodged with the Goat Supervisor from 12.00 noon on Sunday, 5 September. Exit preference to be noted on entry form.

#### Angora and Boer Goats

May leave the Showground from 4.00 pm on Saturday, 11 September. Exit permits to be lodged with the Goat Supervisor by 12.00 noon on Thursday, 9 September

#### Mohair

Fleeces may be removed from 4.00 pm on Saturday, 11 September under the supervision of a Society Councillor. Exhibitors are requested to include precise instructions as to the desired method of disposal at the conclusion of the Show. The Society will re-pack and re-address any exhibit to its place of origin, or re-pack and deliver fleeces to any nominated authorized wool broker in Adelaide. The Society accepts no responsibility for loss or damage in packing and/or transit.

Exhibitors found disregarding any of the Society's General Regulations or Special Regulations set out which apply to this section, may be removed from the Showground or penalised by the Society

The following conditions will strictly apply:

- All entry forms, whether lodged in person or sent by post, or completed on-line must be in the Society's possession at its Administration Office by 5.00 pm on Friday, 25 June 2010 - (Mohair only Friday 2 July at 5.00 pm).
- Postal entry forms and fees will be accepted up to and including entries postmarked on or before the official closing date.
- A late entry option is offered under the following conditions:  
Received or postmarked within 7 days of the official closing date and an additional fee equivalent to three times the standard entry fee per class is to be paid.
- When sending entry forms and fees by post, the onus is on the exhibitor to ensure adequate delivery time.
- Entry forms by facsimile will not be accepted.
- If you require formal acknowledgement that your entry has been received, please include a stamped, self-addressed envelope with your entry form.
- **Absolutely no exception to the above conditions will be made to any exhibitor under any circumstance.**

Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show and that the Special Regulations hereunder set out, which apply to this section only, are merely supplementary to these General Regulations.

### PRIZE MONEY

Exhibitors may request any prize money won during the Royal Adelaide Show be paid by EFT (Electronic Funds Transfer) by completing the form provided. EFT is a more efficient payment method. Exhibitors not requesting payment by EFT will be paid by cheque. Prize money will be paid at the end of October 2010.

### PRIZES

**Dairy Goats and Angora:** First, \$10 and ribbon; second, \$5 and ribbon; third, \$3 and ribbon.

**Boer Goats:** First, \$20 and ribbon; second, \$12 and ribbon; third, \$8 and ribbon.

**Mohair:** First, \$6 and ribbon; second, \$3 and ribbon; third, \$2 and ribbon.

Ribbons will also be awarded in accordance with the following table:

10 to 15 exhibits – fourth ribbon

16 to 20 exhibits – fifth ribbon

Over 20 exhibits – sixth ribbon

### WITHDRAWALS

All withdrawals must be made in writing and can be sent via email to: [info@adelaideshowground.com.au](mailto:info@adelaideshowground.com.au) or faxed to (08) 8212 1533. Emailed withdrawals must include "Withdrawal" in the subject line and the section (eg Goat Section), exhibitor name, class number, exhibit number (if known) and exhibit name (if applicable). Withdrawals must be made at least 24 hours prior to judging.

**IMPORTANT**

It is important that you either:

- confirm that you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, or
- provide your Australian Business Number.

There is a specific area on the entry form to allow you to do this.

**Failure to do either of the above will cause the RA&HS to withhold 48.5% of your prize money in accordance with Australian Tax legislation.**

**OWNERSHIP**

All animals must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor, or held by the exhibitor under a written and recorded lease at the time of entry.

**PRIZE MONEY & GST**

Prize money as stated in the Prize Schedule does not include GST. The prize money which we pay to successful exhibitors depends on information provided to us.

If you confirm that you are GST registered and provide your Australian Business Number, we will pay the appropriate prize money plus 10% GST. We will provide to you a Recipient Created Tax Invoice detailing the GST which you will need to submit to the Australian Tax Office.

In entering the competition, you acknowledge your agreement to the following:

- You will not issue a tax invoice to the RA&HS in respect to prize money received;
- You will notify the RA&HS if you cease to be registered for GST.

If you provide your Australian Business Number but are not registered for GST, we will pay the prize money as detailed in the Prize Schedule without reference to GST.

If you confirm that you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, we will pay the prize money as detailed in the Prize Schedule without reference to GST.

The RA&HS is not a tax consultant and therefore assumes no liability for actions taken as a result of these guidelines. In any instances where an entrant or sponsor is uncertain of the tax implications of their involvement, they should consult their own accountant or tax advisor.

**SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES**

Dairy Goat exhibitors must state on the entry form the animal's name, herd book number, tattoo letters and number, date of birth, sire, dam and name of breeder.

Angora and Boer Goat exhibitors must enter animals in appropriate age classes and special classes.

Proof of age, registration and ownership should be available at the time of inspection and judging.

A goat cannot compete in a special or group class unless it has competed in its age class.

**The consumption of intoxicating liquor in all pavilions, halls and attendants' lockers is forbidden.**

**PEN CLEANING**

Exhibitors shall, to the satisfaction of the Goat Superintendent:

1. Keep each pen allotted to them and their stock in a clean and proper condition throughout the Show.
2. Clean out their pens before 8.00 am each day.
3. Faecal waste must be placed directly into containers provided by the Society.

Failure to comply with these rules shall render the exhibitor liable to a fine no less than \$15 (GST included) for each separate offence.

Exhibitors are requested to provide their own brooms and shovels to clean out pens.

**FIRE PRECAUTIONS**

Precautions will be taken to guard against fire, and to protect the property at the Show, but exhibits will not be insured at the cost of the Society.

Smoking is strictly prohibited in all livestock pavilions and lockers.

No exhibitor or other person shall remove, or displace, or interfere in any way with, or use for any purpose other than the prevention of fire, any article or appliance provided for use in the case of an outbreak of fire upon the Showground, nor shall any exhibitor or other person remove or alter, or add to, or interfere in anyway with any fixture, fitting, article, appliance or thing owned by the Society, or used in such fixture, fitting, article, appliance or thing for any purpose other than for which it is intended by the Society to be used.

**PENALTY FOR NON-EXHIBITION OF ANIMALS**

Every animal entered must be exhibited and paraded before the judge in each class unless a certificate signed by the exhibitor or authorised agent, is lodged with the Society at least 14 days before the opening day of the Show, stating that the animal is unable to compete.

A fine of \$100 (GST included) will be imposed for all late scratchings unless the scratching is notified by a statutory declaration setting out full reasons for scratching, together with an explanatory certificate signed by a Veterinary Surgeon. Notification must be received by 9.00 am on the day prior to judging.

Non-payment of these fines will debar exhibitors from parading their remaining goats before the judge.

**PENS**

Rugs and bags must not be fixed to sides or tops of pens during the time the Show is open to the public.

**HEALTH REGULATIONS****Dairy Goats****1. Johne's Disease**

All exhibitors must complete a "Goat Show and Sale Declaration" form obtained from [www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/programs/jd](http://www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/programs/jd) endorsed by your veterinarian and return this with your Royal Adelaide Show entry forms.

The **minimum** Royal Adelaide Show requirement is that goats be **Assurance Score 5** All Goats attending the Royal Adelaide Show must be **accompanied** by a completed "National Goat Health Statement" obtained at [www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/programs/jd/goat-health/goat-health-statement](http://www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/programs/jd/goat-health/goat-health-statement).

Goats will be exhibited at the Show in order of Goat Assurance Score ranking.

**2. CAE**

Entries from **Accredited** / DGSSA Inc. Market Assurance Scheme for CAE herds shall be accepted if accompanied by: -

- a) A copy of the current Accreditation MASSA for CAE certificate.

Entries from **NON accredited** or NON DGSSA Inc. Market Assurance Scheme for CAE herds shall be accepted if: -

- b) Goats over 12 months of age.- must have two whole herd negative blood tests, 6 months apart, within the previous 12 months. Attach vet report & results to *National Goat Health Statement* when submitting your application
- c) Kids 6-12 months.
  - i) Accompanied by test results for one blood test for CAE within the previous 12 months
  - ii) Non-owner bred kids must comply with Section 2.c.

- d) Kids less than 6 months.
  - i) Owner bred kids less than 6 months will be covered by Section 2.a. or b and do not require testing at this age.
  - ii) Non-owner bred kids less than 6 months of age should be accompanied by two CAE negative-whole herd tests of the herd of origin, as in 2 b above.

**Angora Goats and Boer Goats**

All exhibitors must complete a "Goat Show and Sale Declaration" form obtained from [www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/programs/jd](http://www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/programs/jd) endorsed by your veterinarian, and return this with your Royal Adelaide Show entry documents.

The **minimum** Royal Adelaide Show requirement is that goats be **Assurance Score 5** All Goats attending the Royal Adelaide Show must be **accompanied** by a completed "National Goat Health Statement" obtained at [www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/programs/jd/goat-health/goat-health-statement](http://www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/programs/jd/goat-health/goat-health-statement).

Goats will be exhibited at the Show in order of Goat Assurance Score ranking.

Exhibitors requiring a Johne's Disease Certificate of Compliance from the RA&HS can obtain a copy from the Administration Department (08 8210 5211)

**SICK OR DISEASED ANIMALS**

If, in the opinion of a qualified Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the Society, an animal on the Showground shall be so injured or be so affected by sickness, disease or other ailment as to warrant its destruction or its removal from the Showground as the case may be the Society shall be entitled to have the animal destroyed and/or require the animal to be forthwith removed from the Showground and the exhibitor, upon receipt of such notice, shall forthwith remove such animal and failing such removal by him within the time prescribed by the Society, by written notice to the exhibitor or his representative on the Showground, the Society may remove the animal or cause the animal to be removed and all costs and expenses of removal shall be borne by the exhibitor and shall be refunded to the Society.

Each such animal shall at all times be the sole risk and responsibility of the exhibitor and the person or persons removing the animal shall at all times be deemed to be the agents of the exhibitor and all acts and omissions on the part of such person or persons shall be deemed to be the acts and omissions of the exhibitor who shall indemnify and hold indemnified the Society, its servants and agents from all claims whatsoever in respect of the animal whether by reason of any loss or injury to or caused by the animal or

because of transportation, feeding or housing or otherwise, howsoever.

The pavilion supervisor must be advised immediately of any sick or diseased animals attended to by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon.

#### INTERSTATE STOCK CLEARANCES

#### REGISTRATION

Dairy Goats must be registered with the Dairy Goat Society of Australia.

Copies of Herd Book registration forms, and/or relevant transfer certificates to be submitted with entry forms.

Angora Goats - the sire and dam of the exhibit must be stated on entry form.

Boer Goats must be registered with Australian Breed Societies.

#### BEDDING

Straw will be the bedding in the Goat and Alpaca Pavilion at this year's Royal Adelaide Show.

#### PARADES

Dairy Goats must be paraded in Grand Parades, where possible.

Angora and Boer Goats may be paraded at the discretion of the exhibitor.

#### WHITE ATTIRE

Exhibitors and/or attendants shall wear white dust coats or attire acceptable to their Breed Societies when leading goats in the judging ring and in parades. No exhibitor, or his attendant shall parade stock before the judge whilst wearing attire bearing his name or the name of the stud for which he works.

#### CONFORMATION OF GOATS

An inspection will be made of all Dairy Goats for identification tattoo, breed type, conformation and vermin, from 7.00 pm on Thursday, 2 September.

An inspection will be made of all Angora and Boer Goats for breed type, conformation and vermin at time of arrival.

This will take place in the Pavilion and an attendant must be present to supply any information required by the inspectors.

Any animal rejected as a result of this inspection must be removed from the Showground, the time of removal to be at the discretion of the Committee.

#### LOCKERS

A limited number of lockers are available for Dairy Goat exhibitors on the Showground at \$55 (GST included) per locker whether shared or not, regardless of duration of use. Only current RA&HS members may apply for a locker.

#### FODDER

The sole right to sell fodder on the Showground has been let to Keelan Grain, of 289 Payneham Road, Royston Park, who will sell supplies from their store on the Showground. Sales will be on a cash or Eftpos basis only.

Exhibitors may bring and store in the stock pavilions their basic fodder requirements. Any exhibitor who, in the opinion of the Committee, has more fodder than is considered necessary will be required to remove the excess from the Showground.

Exhibitors must not solicit orders for fodder on the Showground.

#### MILKING

Goats entered in milking classes must be milked and stripped out in the presence of a Steward by 7.00 pm on Friday, 4 September.

#### DISPLAY CARDS

Each stud is permitted to display one sign for every four pens occupied by exhibits, no larger than 1200 mm x 600 mm. Logo, name and address of stud only to be shown.

Strictly no other decoration, delineation, description, display or promotion is allowed, unless prior approval is given by the Society.

#### AGES OF DAIRY GOATS

The table below shows the dates on or between which goats must be born to compete in the respective age classes. The ages of all exhibits shall be calculated to 1 September of the current year, provided that no animal unborn at closing date of entries will be accepted for competition.

Breed to be shown on entry form. Highest placed doe of each breed is eligible for senior breed championships.

**Class 2–Saanen Doe in milk**, 3 years and under 6 years.

**Class 3–Anglo Nubian Doe in milk**, 3 years and under 6 years.

**Class 4–Toggenburg doe in milk**, 3 years and under 6 years.

**Class 5–British Alpine doe in milk**, 3 years and under 6 years.

**Class 6–Saanen doe in milk**, under 3 years.

**Class 7–Anglo Nubian Doe in milk**, under 3 years.

**Class 8–Toggenburg Doe in milk**, under 3 years.

**Class 9–British Alpine Doe in milk**, under 3 years.

**Class 10–Australian Brown or Australian Melaan Doe in milk**, under 6 years.

**Class 11–Doe, dry, any age and breed**, must have kidded within the last two years. Highest placed doe of each breed are eligible for senior breed championships. Breed to be stated on entry form.

**Class 12–THE ABACUS DAIRY GOAT TROPHY Doe, with Best Udder**, on first lactation; to be judged in milk and milked out. Animals to be drawn from general classes. Name of animal not required on the entry form.

**Class 14–THE POTTAGE ANNABELLE TROPHY Type and Production - 24 hour**

Animals to be drawn from general classes. Open to all does which have been tested at:

- 24-hour milk test to be conducted at the current Royal Adelaide Show.
- 24-hour test conducted by a branch of the Dairy Goat Society of Australia on/or since the previous Royal Adelaide Show. Highest figure obtained since the previous year's Royal Adelaide Show milk test to be used. Points to be allotted as follows:  
Type - 100 points maximum;  
Production - 100 points will be allotted to the doe with the highest Q\*points. Other entries will be awarded on a pro rata basis. Provision of production figures is the responsibility of the exhibitor.

**Class 15–THE BRAIMAC STUD TROPHY Type and Production - Herd Recording**

Animals to be drawn from general classes. Open to all does on the official Dairy Goat Society of Australia Herd Recording Scheme.

- Figures obtained from the most recent completed lactation, or the current uncompleted lactation may be used, provided that the completed lactation was commenced at or since two years prior to this year's Royal Adelaide Show.
- The highest figure so obtained may be used. Production figures to be supplied with entries. Points to be allotted as follows:  
Type - 100 points maximum;  
Production - the sum of the weight of butterfat and DGSA herd production award points will be divided by 3 (eg a doe with 32kg butterfat and a figure of R118 has production points of 150/3=50)

**Class 16–24-Hour Milk Production Test**

Animals to be drawn from general classes.

1. Entries in this class must be milked and stripped out under inspection at 7pm on Wednesday, 2 September.
2. All animals in the class shall be milked at 7am and 7pm on Thursday, 3 September. This milk shall be weighed and sampled, the two samples to be processed by an approved testing company.
3. The test is designed to show yields under normal feeding conditions - no entry may be force-fed or drenched during the test or for 24 hours prior to its commencement.
4. No animal fats, milk or milk products or any product designed to artificially stimulate lactation may be given to entries in the class during the test or for 24 hours prior to its commencement.
5. Placings shall be determined on the weight of milk. Any animal with a butterfat yield of less than 3% shall be ineligible for a prize.

## Livestock & Animal Exhibitors Public Liability Insurance Explanation

WHEREAS Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Society of South Australia Inc has agreed to effect a Public Liability insurance for certain Livestock Exhibitors at the 2010 Adelaide Show, the following applies:-

<b>Insured Party:</b>	Livestock and Animal Exhibitors participating in competitions and events
<b>Period of Insurance:</b>	From seven days prior to the Show until seven days thereafter
<b>Insured Activities:</b>	All activities undertaken whilst within and from the confines of the event venue consistent with the Insured's livestock exhibit activity including setting up and removal
<b>Description of Cover:</b>	Insurance in respect of the Insured Party's liability to pay costs and compensation in respect of loss of or damage to third party property and death of or injury to third party persons caused by and arising out of the Insured activities, all subject to the Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Society of South Australia Inc policy terms, conditions, exclusions and warranties, etc.
<b>Amount of Cover:</b>	\$10,000,000 any one occurrence
<b>Deductible:</b>	\$10,000 any one occurrence
<b>Geographic Limits:</b>	At and from the event venue
<b>Claims Payable:</b>	Worldwide excluding claims made USA and Canada
<b>Insurer(s):</b>	Certain underwriters at Lloyds of London
<b>Address:</b>	London Underwriting Centre, 3 Minster Court, Mincing Lane, London EC3R 7DD
<b>Policy Number:</b>	<b>08GC0M0430</b>

### Important Conditions:

1. The Insured Party must exercise reasonable care to maintain all premises, fittings and plant in sound condition.
2. The Insured Party must take all reasonable precautions to prevent injury and damage to persons and property.
3. The Insured Party must give immediate notice of an incident which may give rise to a claim or of receipt of advice of a claim.
4. The Insured Party must not make any admission, offer or promise in connection with any claim and must not any time admit liability.
5. The Insured Party must made themselves aware of and comply with the following Notices:-

- THIS INSURANCE ONLY APPLIES TO INSURED PARTIES ENTERING COMPETITION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE GENERAL REGULATIONS.**

### RISK MANAGEMENT HAZARD REPORTING

Competitors must notify the Area/Pavilion Supervisor or the Venue Management Office immediately of any hazards detected. Hazards are any situation that could result in:

- Injury, illness or death to people or animals
- Damage or destruction to property

### INCIDENT REPORTING

Competitors must notify the Area/Pavilion Supervisor or the Venue Management Office immediately an incident occurs which has resulted in:

- The injury, illness or death of any person or animal
- The damage, destruction or loss of property
- A near miss incident that could have resulted in the consequences listed in 1 and 2

### WASTE DISPOSAL

All waste including liquids must be disposed of responsibly. Storm drains must not be used for the disposal of any waste.

### HAZARD MINIMISATION

All areas must be kept in a clean and tidy order with clearly defined and available access and exit routes at all times. Build up of combustible waste must be avoided.

Care must be taken to minimise trip hazards and obstacles that people may walk into. Avoid laying unprotected cables or pipes on or above paths, walkways or roads.

### HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

Entry to and remaining on the Showground is entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor and to the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor releases the Society (which term includes in this clause the Society's officers, employees, members and agents), from all claims and demands of every kind resulting from any accident, damage or injury occurring at the Showground, and without limitation, the Exhibitor acknowledges:

  - the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any Exhibit;
  - the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees and Agents;
  - the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to a Motor Vehicle or any of its contents whilst it is located on the Showground; and
  - without limiting Regulations 1 (a) and 1 (b) above, the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury resulting from the sale, treatment, failure to treat, destruction, disposal or other dealing with any Exhibit, or for loss, damage or injury to any personal belongings, equipment or property brought onto the Showground.
- Indemnity

To the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor must indemnify and keep indemnified the Society and its officers, employees, members and agents from and against all actions, claims, demands, losses, damages, costs, expenses and liabilities including without limitation, consequential loss and loss of profits for which the Society is or may be or become liable in respect of or arising from:

  - loss, damage or injury to any person in connection with the Exhibit or the relevant Event;
  - without limiting Regulation 2(a), loss, damage or injury to any other Exhibit or Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees, Agents, or to the property of the Society, or its members, or to the general public, caused or contributed to or by any act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents; and

(c) without limiting Regulation 2(a), loss, damage or injury to the Exhibit, or the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees, or Agents caused or contributed by an act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the transportation, feeding or housing of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor.

### 3. Removal from Showground

Without prejudice to any other provision in these Regulations, where the Society, its officers, employees members or agents removes an Exhibit, or causes an Exhibit to be removed from the Showground, the Exhibit is removed or caused to be removed entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor. The person or persons removing the Exhibit will be deemed to be the agent of the Exhibitor, and his or her acts and omissions will be deemed to be the acts and omissions of the Exhibitor.

### 4. Insurance

The Society will arrange compulsory Owner's Liability insurance cover for all Exhibitors of Exhibits being animals. The Exhibitor is bound by the terms and conditions of this insurance and by Statutory Duties as defined under the Insurance Contracts Act (1984). Details of the Compulsory Owner's Liability insurance are set out in the Relevant Schedule

### 5. Personal effects

The Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss or damage caused to personal belongings, equipment or property which is brought onto the Showground by an Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents.

### EMERGENCY INFORMATION

Emergency information and Emergency Assembly Points for the various animal pavilions and stables will be included with Exhibitor Entry Detail Returns and Notice to Exhibitor mail outs. Competitors should be familiar with these plans.

### FIRST AID

During the Royal Adelaide Show, St John Ambulance provides First Aid Services but it is suggested that competitors have a basic First Aid kit if minor injuries are a possibility.

### RA&HS EMERGENCY FACILITIES

Fire fighting and other emergency equipment must not be removed or used for any other purpose. Missing or unserviceable equipment should be reported to the Venue Management Office immediately.

### SMOKING

The RA&HS Smoking Code does not permit smoking inside buildings, within 10 metres of a building entrance, around combustibles, during public performances or while handling hazardous materials.

### TRAFFIC CONTROL

The RA&HS Traffic Control Code imposes speed restrictions within the Showground. For the duration of the Royal Adelaide Show the speed limit is 10 kph. The use of vehicles inside the Showground is closely managed during the Royal Adelaide Show. Conditions of entry will be provided with the issue of Vehicle Entry Permits.

### ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

1. Competitors should supply their own "Safety Switch" (RCD) for installation at each power outlet they use.
2. Extension cords must be earthed and all electrical appliances must be earthed or double insulated. Appliances must be in sound working order and safety tagged.
3. Power boards with overload protection can only be used at the discretion of the Venue Services Manager.
4. The use of double adaptors is strictly prohibited.
5. Appliances and power cables must not be used or laid through any area that may become wet.
6. Power cables must not be laid across walkways, paths, roads or any area where damage could occur to the cable.
7. Bar (resistance) heaters must not be used.
8. Light sockets must not be used for any other purpose than for lighting.
