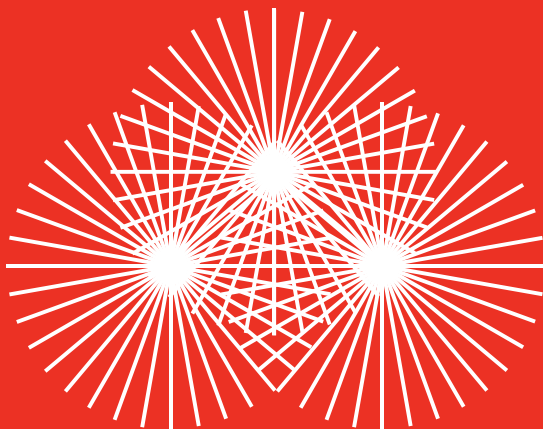

## \*\* IMPORTANT INFORMATION \*\*

Exhibitors are advised to carefully read the timetable below as there have been some minor changes for the 2010 Royal Adelaide Show.

### ARRIVAL TIMES

**Cattle will not be admitted to the Showground before 8.00 am on Friday, 3 September.**

Exhibitors are encouraged to arrive between 8.00 am and 4.00 pm on Friday, 3 September and 8.00 am and 12.00 noon on Saturday, 4 September.

If exhibitors are arriving outside of these times, they should contact the Dairy Cattle office or a member of the Dairy Cattle Committee.

**All cattle must be on the Showground by 12.00 noon on Saturday, 4 September.**

**Cattle will be scanned on arrival and may be scanned on departure.**

### ENTRY GATE

All cattle to be unloaded at Leader Street No 3 Car Park – NO UNLOADING OF CATTLE ON THE SHOWGROUND.

### INSPECTION OF CATTLE

An inspection will be made of all cattle exhibits for identification tattoo or photo and major defects on Sunday, 5 September, commencing at 1.00 pm. Exhibitors of all cattle shall produce registration certificates of animals entered.

This will take place in the cattle stalls and an attendant must be present to supply any information required by the inspectors. Any animal rejected as a result of this inspection cannot be offered for sale and must be removed from the Showground, the time of removal to be at the discretion of the Committee.

**Holstein Exhibitors** - Any animal whose registration certificate does not have a photo attached to the certificate at the time of inspection will be deemed to be ineligible to compete

### FEATURE BREED

Feature Breed exhibitors must remain for the entirety of the Show. Departure of Feature Breed cattle will be permitted on Saturday, 11 September from 2.00 pm.

## CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES

FRIDAY, 25 JUNE 2010 at 5.00 pm

The following conditions will strictly apply:

- All entry forms, whether lodged in person or sent by post, must be in the Society's possession at its Administration Office by 5.00 pm on Friday, 25 June 2010.
- Entry forms by facsimile are strictly forbidden and will be destroyed.
- When submitting entry forms by post it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure adequate delivery time.
- Postal entries post marked prior to closing date will be accepted.
- Absolutely no exception to the above conditions will be made to any exhibitor under any circumstance.
- Late entries will be accepted on payment of \$110 member, \$140 non-member fee by the 23 August 2010.

### ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF YOUR ENTRY

If you require formal acknowledgement that your entry has been received, please include a stamped, self-addressed envelope with your entry.

### ENTRY FEES (GST INCLUDED)

Exhibitors will be required to book and pay for an exhibit space at the following rates:

Member – \$40 per space  
Non-Member – \$55 per space

Note: The above rates cover class and group entry fees and bedding fee.

An exhibitor may, for the cost of \$40, book an extra space by 23 August 2010, provided the animal which fills that space is named on the original entry form.

Exhibitors may pay a fee of \$40 for a replacement animal where a space has been booked but the animal was not nominated on the original entry form up to 23 August 2010. Payment to include nominated animal details.

### ENTRY DETAILS

Exhibitors may nominate entries for a number of animals not exceeding 150% of the spaces booked. Details of all animals entered and class numbers must be shown on the entry form. Exhibitors shall not bring onto the Showground any more animals than spaces booked and the Committee reserves the right to impose a fine of \$40 (GST included) per space not occupied by an exhibit.

### SPECIAL REGULATIONS

Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show and that the Special Regulations hereunder set out, which apply to this section only, are merely supplementary to and subject to the Regulations.

A copy of the General Regulations may be obtained from the Society's website at [www.adelaideshowground.com.au](http://www.adelaideshowground.com.au) or a copy may be obtained upon request from the Society's Administration Office.

### ALSO

1. An exhibitor shall not engage or be knowingly concerned in unethical conduct.
2. No drug, hormone or tranquillizer shall be administered to any animal/exhibit if in the opinion of the appointed veterinary surgeon any such like drugs, hormones or tranquillizers are likely to affect or enhance the performance of the said animal.  
The pavilion supervisor, in consultation with the Council members, may debar the animal from competing.
3. Any animal which has been treated and its milk is not eligible for human consumption must have a treatment report form completed by the exhibitor/handler and given to the Dairy Manager prior to milking.
4. The following practices are strictly prohibited:
  - a. An operation or any kind of surgery, materially altering the structure or the natural conformation of any part of the animal's body.
  - b. The infusion or injection of any drugs or any other substance or the insertion of any object into the teats, blood vessels, muscles or under the skin of any animal to restrict the flow of milk or alter its natural physical attributes.
  - c. The setting of the teats of an animal with any form of glue or other setting substance or any other action which alters the natural teat placement of an animal.
5. The Dairy Cattle and Pig Committee shall be the sole arbiter to any of the above clauses and its decision after consultation with the said exhibitor shall be final.
6. Fines or suspension or disqualification shall be the sole responsibility of the Council.
7. Injecting or treating of animals whilst in the Exhibition Dairy when open to the public is not permitted.
8. The Council reserves the right to swab, at random, any dairy animal.
9. Sealing of teats is permissible.

### SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES

**Registration Certificates (or copies) are not required at time of making entry but are required at inspection time at the Royal Adelaide Show.**

The Society will accept only those entries which are registered at the time of entry and for which the following is detailed on the entry form:

1. CLASS NUMBER
2. NAME OF ANIMAL
3. REGISTRATION NUMBER
4. TATTOO NUMBER – excluding Holstein
5. DATE OF BIRTH
6. NAME OF SIRE AND DAM
7. NAME OF BREEDER

**“Pending” registrations will not be accepted.**

**All Dairy Cattle exhibitors must bring the original or a copy of the registration certificate or lease agreement or photograph (Holstein) for all animals entered and these must be available for perusal at the time of inspection.**

### PRIZES

Prize money will be paid as specified in individual classes.

First to fourth prize ribbons will be awarded in all classes. In addition, prize ribbons may be awarded in accordance with the following table:

16 to 20 exhibits – Fifth Ribbon.

Over 20 exhibits – Sixth Ribbon.

Champions and Reserve Champions will be selected from first and second prize winners in relevant classes.

Exhibitors may request any prize money won during the Royal Adelaide Show be paid by EFT (Electronic Funds Transfer) by completing the form provided. EFT is a more efficient payment method.

**Exhibitors not requesting payment by EFT will be paid by cheque at the end of October.**

### PRIZE MONEY AND GST

Prize money as stated in the Prize Schedule does not include GST.

The prize money which we pay to successful exhibitors depends on information provided to us.

If you confirm that you are GST registered and provide your Australian Business Number, we will pay the appropriate prize money plus 10% GST. We will provide to you a Recipient Created Tax Invoice detailing the GST which you will need to submit to the Australian Tax Office. In entering the competition, you acknowledge your agreement to the following:

- You will not issue a tax invoice to the RA&HS in respect to prize money received;

- You will notify the RA&HS if you cease to be registered for GST.

If you provide your Australian Business Number but are not registered for GST, we will pay the prize money as detailed in the Prize Schedule without reference to GST.

If you confirm that you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, we will pay the prize money as detailed in the Prize Schedule without reference to GST.

### TROPHIES

All trophies and special prizes will be paid to the winner by the Society by cheque, unless the donor specifically wishes to provide a trophy.

All trophies must be in the hands of the Society at least 14 days prior to the opening day of the Show.

### RA&HS SASHES

Will be awarded to all Champions, Reserve Champion, Supreme Champion and Most Successful Exhibitors and will also be awarded to Cow with Best Udder, Type and Production Classes, and Production Ribbons Classes

All Champion and Reserve Champion in Breed Classes will also receive RA&HS Rosettes

### IMPORTANT

It is important that you either:

- confirm that you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, or
- provide your Australian Business Number.

There is a specific area on the entry form to allow you to do this.

**Failure to do either of the above will cause the RA&HS to withhold 48.5% of your prize money in accordance with Australian Tax legislation.**

The RA&HS is not a tax consultant and therefore assumes no liability for actions taken as a result of these guidelines. In any instances where an entrant or sponsor is uncertain of the tax implications of their involvement, they should consult their own accountant or tax advisor.

For all championships, all first and second placegetters from the respective classes must be paraded.

### YOUR PRIVACY

If you do not want your details to be made available to other parties, please tick the box on the entry form supplied by the RA&HS. Your personal information will only be used by the RA&HS to maintain contact with you and allow us to manage your entries. The RA&HS reserves the right to inform prize sponsors the details of recipients to enable distribution of their voucher/product prizes to the winner. Please note: By ticking the box to suppress your details, your name and address will not appear in the Catalogue (if applicable).

### OWNERSHIP

All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor or held by the exhibitor under a written and recorded lease at time of entry.

**Cattle will be scanned on arrival and may be scanned on departure.**

### STOCK TRUCK PARKING

An area is available in the Adelaide City Council's parklands for the parking of stock trucks during the Royal Adelaide Show. For further information contact Adelaide City Council Customer Centre Line on (08) 8203 7203.

### FIRE PRECAUTIONS

Precautions will be taken to guard against fire, and to protect the property at the Show, but exhibits will not be insured at the cost of the Society. Smoking is strictly prohibited in all livestock pavilions and lockers.

No exhibitor or other person shall remove, or displace, or interfere in any way with, or use for any purpose other than the prevention of fire, any article or appliance provided for use in the case of an outbreak of fire upon the Showground, nor shall any exhibitor or other person remove or alter, or add to, or interfere in any way with any fixture, fitting, article, appliance or thing owned by the Society, or used in such fixture, fitting, article, appliance or thing for any purpose other than for which it is intended by the Society to be used.

### COMPULSORY REGISTRATION OF STOCK

All cattle must be registered in the numbered section of the Stud Book for its particular breed. Entries of appendix cattle will not be accepted except in Illawarra classes where section X and Y cattle are eligible, and section Y cattle whose sire and dam appear in the Illawarra Herd Book are eligible.

The Society will also accept Appendix 1 and 2 female Holstein and Guernsey entries and Appendix Illawarra Cattle Registered in Section Y.

### PARADES

All prize winning animals must be paraded as per Programme of Parades displayed in stock pavilions. Non-prize winning animals may be paraded with the Committee's sanction.

Exhibitors shall be liable to a fine of \$5 in each case in which the order, of the Committee, to parade is not obeyed, and shall be liable to forfeit any prize awarded to their exhibit or exhibits.

**Exhibits participating in a parade must be handled and/or controlled by a competent handler.**

### EXHIBITS

Cattle must not be rugged during the time the Show is open to the public.

Cattle which are not thoroughly tractable to lead will not be allowed on the Showground.

A dehorned animal shall not be penalised for the absence of horns.

Any cow or heifer entered as dry, if in milk at time of competition, may compete as a wet cow, or vice versa. A dry cow is one that has been in milk for nine months or more, and has been milked out immediately before entering the judging ring, or a cow not giving any milk, visibly in calf. This cow must have produced a calf by natural birth within 18 months of the closing date of entries.

### CALVES

Only calves born in transit or at the Show may remain on the Showground.

Exhibitors are required to dispose of all afterbirth when animals have calved.

### FOSTER MOTHERS

A dairy cow must not be used as a foster mother for any other exhibit whilst these animals are on the Showground.

### INFECTIOUS/NOTIFIABLE DISEASES

Exhibitors must certify their animals brought onto the Showground for competition have not been exposed to any infectious/notifiable disease/s to the best of their knowledge.

### SICK OR DISEASED ANIMALS

If, in the opinion of a qualified veterinary surgeon appointed by the Society, an animal on the Showground shall be so injured or be so affected by sickness, disease or other ailment as to warrant its destruction or its removal from the Showground as the case may be the Society shall be entitled to have the animal destroyed and/or require the animal to be forthwith removed from the Showground. The exhibitor, upon receipt of such notice, shall forthwith remove such animal and failing such removal by them within the time prescribed by the Society, by written notice to the exhibitor or his representative on the Showground,

the Society may remove the animal or cause the animal to be removed and all costs and expenses of removal shall be borne by the exhibitor and shall be refunded to the Society.

Each such animal shall at all times be the sole risk and responsibility of the exhibitor and the person or persons removing the animal shall at all times be deemed to be the agents of the exhibitor and all acts and omissions on the part of such person or persons shall be deemed to be the acts and omissions of the exhibitor who shall indemnify and hold indemnified the Society, its servants and agents from all claims whatsoever in respect of the animal whether by reason of any loss or injury to or caused by the animal or because of transportation, feeding or housing or otherwise howsoever.

The pavilion supervisor must be advised immediately of any sick or diseased animals attended to by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon.

#### RINGWORM

1. Any animal found infected with ringworm prior to the Royal Show can still be brought to the Showground provided that a veterinary certificate is produced on arrival stating that the veterinarian has seen the animal treated and/or washed in the last 4 days with an appropriate fungicide.

2. That further washings take place not more than 4 days apart while on the Showground and in the presence of the duty veterinarian.

3. Cattle found infected for the first time while on the Showground - invoke Rule 2.

4. That Breed Societies inspectors reserve the right to ban any animals from the judging ring if an attack is so bad that, in their opinion, the showing of that animal is likely to detract from the spectacle of the Show ring.

5. Health certificates issued by the Society's Veterinarian will take precedence over health certificates issued by exhibitor's veterinarians.

#### ENZOOTIC BOVINE LEUCOSIS (EBL)

All dairy Cattle must be from Monitored Free status herds (see section 2 "Dairy Cattle Herd Health Statement for Shows and Sales") [www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/programs/jd](http://www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/programs/jd)  
All interstate dairy cattle require a negative EBL blood test and results attached to the SA Form 1 (see below)

#### JOHNE'S DISEASE.

Dairy Cattle attending the Show must be a minimum of Dairy Score 3.

Please return your completed "Dairy Cattle Herd Health Statement for Shows and Sales", endorsed by an Inspector (together with test results if required), with your Royal Adelaide Show entry documents.

- All Dairy exhibitors must complete a "Dairy Cattle Herd Health Statement for Shows and Sales", endorsed by an Inspector. You can obtain this form at [www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/programs/jd](http://www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/programs/jd)
- Dairy cattle with a Dairy Assurance Score lower than 7 and over 2 years of age must have a negative JD blood test with test results attached to the "Dairy Cattle Herd Health Statement for Shows and Sales" within 90 days of the opening of the show.

Interstate exhibitors need to also complete a SA Form 1 that travels with the cattle

#### INTERSTATE STOCK CLEARANCES

Exhibitors requiring interstate stock clearances, are advised to contact Amelia Bartlett, PIRSA Animal Health Officer on 08 8535 6405.

#### FODDER

The sole right to sell fodder on the Showground has been let to Keelan Grain, of 289 Payneham Road, Royston Park, who will sell supplies from their store on the Showground. Sales will be on a cash or bankcard basis only.

Exhibitors may bring and store in the stock pavilions their basic fodder requirements. Any exhibitor who, in the opinion of the Committee, has more fodder than is considered necessary will be required to remove the excess from the Showground.

Exhibitors must not solicit orders for fodder on the Showground. All Dairy Cattle exhibitors will be required to provide their own feed bins.

#### SUBMISSION OF ANIMALS ENTERED

There is no restriction on the number of animals per exhibitor in each class.

Should the number of animals entered exceed the number which can be accommodated, the Society reserves the right to reduce the number in whatever manner it deems fit.

The number of animals entered must not exceed 150% of the spaces booked.

#### DEFINITION OF BREEDER

The breeder of an animal is the registered owner of its dam at the time of birth, excepting in the Holstein-Friesian section in which case the Holstein-Friesian Cattle Association definition will apply.

#### STORAGE SPACE

Storage space will be allocated to exhibitors if possible.

#### STALL SPACE

The depth of each stall space will be 2.8 metres. All boards be positioned no further than 2.8 metres out from the walls and that **clipping chutes must be at a 90° angle to the wall and no longer than 2.8 metres from the wall.** All equipment, including feed and wheelbarrows, be stored within the 2.8 metres.

#### STALL CLEANING

Exhibitors will, to the satisfaction of the Society:

- Keep the area allotted to them and their animals in a clean and proper condition throughout the Show.
- Clean their area regularly. Refuse must be deposited in the manure bins provided.
- Manure must not be deposited in the alleyways or general purpose rubbish bins.
- General purpose rubbish must not be deposited in manure bins.
- To assist in the transfer of manure to the bins provided, please bring own wheelbarrow or bucket.

#### CLIPPING OF EXHIBITS

Exhibitors shall not clip Dairy Cattle on the Showground between 10.00 pm and 6.00 am unless in an area designated by the committee.

#### WASH BAYS

Please note that watering troughs have been removed from the wash bay area. Exhibitors are requested to supply their own watering vessel.

#### WHITE ATTIRE

Exhibitors and/or attendants shall wear white or attire acceptable to their breed societies when leading cattle in the judging ring and in parades. No exhibitor, or his attendant shall parade stock before the Judge whilst wearing attire bearing his own or the name of the Stud for which he works.

#### EXHIBITORS' CARDS

No exhibitor shall display any prize card, display card, or ribbon on his animal or pen other than those issued or approved of by the Society for the current Show. Display cards will be supplied by the Society and on these the exhibitor must show catalogue number, name of exhibit, date of birth, name of sire and dam, name of exhibitor and production.

#### DOGS NOT ALLOWED

Dogs will not be permitted in the Dairy Cattle area.

#### LOCKERS

A limited number of lockers are available on the Showground. The Society will, subject to availability, allocate lockers to exhibitors.

Applications for lockers must be made out not later than 25 June, 2010. Locker fee \$35 (GST included) per locker whether shared or not.

**Lockers will (subject to demand) be allotted on the following basis:**

- Exhibitors with one, two or three spaces will be allotted a share locker.
- Exhibitors with less than ten spaces can apply for one locker only.
- Exhibitors with ten or more spaces can apply for two lockers only.

The use of cooking or heating apparatus in lockers is strictly prohibited. The consumption of intoxicating liquor in lockers is forbidden. Facilities for cooking are available in the mess room at the rear of the brick cattle pavilion.

#### DAIRY COMPLEX

The Society and the Dairy Authority of South Australia have combined to provide a 12 unit Dairy complex licensed by the Metropolitan Milk Board to be situated in the north-west corner of Pavilion 13.

All cows will be required to be milked in this complex except for:

- Sick animals.
- Special circumstances approved by the Dairy Cattle Committee.

The complex will be open for milking from 3.00 pm on Friday, 3 September.

#### RA&HS EXHIBITION DAIRY

##### Rules & Regulations

- No use of portable milking machines except at the discretion of the dairy supervisor.
- Dairy managers will coordinate all operations in the dairy.
- Breed representatives to determine milking roster which will be strictly adhered to.
- Individual cows will be identified by RA&HS Catalogue numbers.
- Infections problem-milk cows MUST be milked on either of the two units outside the Exhibition Dairy.
- Cows will be individually sampled every milking and tested for components, cell-count and antibiotic residues.
- Proceeds from milk will be credited to exhibitors.
- Severe penalties will be enforced for contamination of bulk milk.
- All cows teats are to be washed before milking and dipped/sprayed after milking. Cups should be reverse flushed after the milking of mastitic cows and before the next cow is milked on those cups.

10. Rugs must be off all cattle at all milkings.
11. **Dress – ALL PEOPLE WORKING IN THE PIT MUST BE PROPERLY ATTIRED. Dairy staff will wear white aprons, white rubber boots and hat. Other workers in the pit must also wear at least a white apron, white rubber boots and hat. The suitability of attire worn must ensure the appropriate image is presented for the benefit of the Society and Dairy Industry.**
12. **JUDGING DAY** – Dairy will close at 7.00 am and re-open at 9.00 am or at the discretion of the Dairy Manager.
13. Disputes will be referred to the dairy supervisor and will be resolved by the Dairy Cattle and Pig Committee Councillors.
14. The consumption of alcohol, and smoking is banned within the confines of the dairy.
15. **Leg bands must be on all cows prior to entry in milking dairy.**

**COSTS AND DISPOSAL OF CONTAMINATED MILK**

As this complex is a registered dairy the same conditions apply as with on-farm dairies – ie any exhibitors who supply milk that contaminates a bulk tank or a tanker load of milk will be held financially responsible for:

- The cost of collection and transport of the milk to the processing factory, including a replacement load of market milk.
- Value of the milk lost due to contamination.
- Cost of disposing of the contaminated milk.

Disposal costs will vary and producers will be given the option of disposing of the milk on their own properties. Contaminated milk is considered to be any milk containing antibiotic, colostrum, blood or strong taint or smell.

**PRODUCTION CLASSES**

**It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to provide production certificates. All production certificates to be handed to the Dairy Cattle Supervisor's Office by 12:00 noon Sunday of the Show.**

In type and production and all other classes requiring production qualifications, production figures obtained at official tests, and by recorder sampling and owner sampling will be accepted. Calculations for the type and production class are to be calculated on one (1) point for each five (5) kilograms of fat and protein over the following standard for age figures.

J 2 year old	240 kg protein and fat
S 2 year old	260 kg protein and fat
J 3 year old	280 kg protein and fat
S 3 year old	290 kg protein and fat
J 4 year old	300 kg protein and fat
S 4 year old	310 kg protein and fat
M	320 kg protein and fat

In the case of a draw, a 75% ratio factor will be introduced to decide the winner.

J 2 YEAR OLD (under 30 months)	on or after 1/3/08
S 2 YEAR OLD (30 - 36 months)	1/9/07 - 28/2/08
J 3 YEAR OLD (36 - 42 months)	1/3/06 - 31/8/07
S 3 YEAR OLD (42 - 48 months)	1/9/06 - 28/2/07
J 4 YEAR OLD (48 - 54 months)	1/3/06 - 31/8/06
S 4 YEAR OLD (54 - 60 months)	1/9/05 - 28/2/06
Mature (over 60 months)	on or before 31/8/05

## COMPETITIVE EXHIBITORS

### Conditions of Entry

#### RISK MANAGEMENT HAZARD REPORTING

Competitors must notify the Area/Pavilion Supervisor or the Venue Management Office immediately of any hazards detected. Hazards are any situation that could result in:

1. Injury, illness or death to people or animals
2. Damage or destruction to property

#### INCIDENT REPORTING

Competitors must notify the Area/Pavilion Supervisor or the Venue Management Office immediately an incident occurs which has resulted in:

1. The injury, illness or death of any person or animal
2. The damage, destruction or loss of property
3. A near miss incident that could have resulted in the consequences listed in 1 and 2

#### WASTE DISPOSAL

All waste including liquids must be disposed of responsibly. Storm drains must not be used for the disposal of any waste.

#### HAZARD MINIMISATION

All areas must be kept in a clean and tidy order with clearly defined and available access and exit routes at all times. Build up of combustible waste must be avoided.

Care must be taken to minimise trip hazards and obstacles that people may walk into. Avoid laying unprotected cables or pipes on or above paths, walkways or roads.

#### HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

The RA&HS are to be advised of all hazardous materials that are to be brought onto the Showground. Appropriate warning signs and Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) will need to be provided before allowing these materials on site.

#### MEDIA COMMENTS

Any public comment on emergencies, incidents or other venue matters should only come from the RA&HS. The key media spokesperson for the RA&HS is the Marketing Manager.

#### DUTY OF CARE

All competitors have a "Duty of Care" to avoid exposing themselves or other people to situations which could lead to injury. This "Duty of Care" extends to the prevention of damage to property.

#### LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY

1. Release  
Entry to and remaining on the Showground is entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor and to the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor releases the Society (which term includes in this clause the Society's officers, employees, members and agents), from all claims and demands of every kind resulting from any accident, damage or injury occurring at the Showground, and without limitation, the Exhibitor acknowledges:
  - (a) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any Exhibit;
  - (b) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees and Agents;
  - (c) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to a Motor Vehicle or any of its contents whilst it is located on the Showground; and
  - (d) without limiting Regulations 1 (a) and 1 (b) above, the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury resulting from the sale, treatment, failure to treat, destruction, disposal or other dealing with any Exhibit, or for loss, damage or injury to any personal belongings, equipment or property brought onto the Showground.
2. Indemnity  
To the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor must indemnify and keep indemnified the Society and its officers, employees, members and agents from and against all actions, claims, demands, losses, damages, costs, expenses and liabilities including without limitation, consequential loss and loss of profits for which the Society is or may be or become liable in respect of or arising from:
  - (a) loss, damage or injury to any person in connection with the Exhibit or the relevant Event;
  - (b) without limiting Regulation 2(a), loss, damage or injury to any other Exhibit or Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees, Agents, or to the property of the Society, or its members, or to the general public, caused or contributed to or by any act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents; and

## COMPETITIVE EXHIBITORS

### Conditions of Entry

- (c) without limiting Regulation 2(a), loss, damage or injury to the Exhibit, or the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees, or Agents caused or contributed by an act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the transportation, feeding or housing of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor.
3. Removal from Showground  
Without prejudice to any other provision in these Regulations, where the Society, its officers, employees, members or agents removes an Exhibit, or causes an Exhibit to be removed from the Showground, the Exhibit is removed or caused to be removed entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor. The person or persons removing the Exhibit will be deemed to be the agent of the Exhibitor, and his or her acts and omissions will be deemed to be the acts and omissions of the Exhibitor.
4. Insurance  
The Society will arrange Compulsory Owner's Liability insurance cover for all Exhibitors of Exhibits being animals. The Exhibitor is bound by the terms and conditions of this insurance and by Statutory Duties as defined under the Insurance Contracts Act (1984). Details of the Compulsory Owner's Liability insurance are set out in the Relevant Schedule
5. Personal effects  
The Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss or damage caused to personal belongings, equipment or property which is brought onto the Showground by an Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents.

#### EMERGENCY INFORMATION

Emergency information and Emergency Assembly Points for the various animal pavilions and stables will be included with Exhibitor Entry Detail Returns and Notice to Exhibitor mail outs. Competitors should be familiar with these plans.

#### FIRST AID

During the Royal Adelaide Show, St John Ambulance provides First Aid Services but it is suggested that competitors have a basic First Aid kit if minor injuries are a possibility.

#### RA&HS EMERGENCY FACILITIES

Fire fighting and other emergency equipment must not be removed or used for any other purpose. Missing or unserviceable equipment should be reported to the Venue Management Office immediately.

#### SMOKING

The RA&HS Smoking Code does not permit smoking inside buildings, within 10 metres of a building entrance, around combustibles, during public performances or while handling hazardous materials.

#### TRAFFIC CONTROL

The RA&HS Traffic Control Code imposes speed restrictions within the Showground. For the duration of the Royal Adelaide Show the speed limit is 10 kph. The use of vehicles inside the Showground is closely managed during the Royal Adelaide Show. Conditions of entry will be provided with the issue of Vehicle Entry Permits.

#### ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

1. Competitors should supply their own "Safety Switch" (RCD) for installation at each power outlet they use.
2. Extension cords must be earthed and all electrical appliances must be earthed or double insulated. Appliances must be in sound working order and safety tagged.
3. Power boards with overload protection can only be used at the discretion of the Venue Services Manager.
4. The use of double adaptors is strictly prohibited.
5. Appliances and power cables must not be used or laid through any area that may become wet.
6. Power cables must not be laid across walkways, paths, roads or any area where damage could occur to the cable.
7. Bar (resistance) heaters must not be used.
8. Light sockets must not be used for any other purpose than for lighting.

# Livestock & Animal Exhibitors Public Liability Insurance Explanation

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WHEREAS Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Society of South Australia Inc has agreed to effect a Public Liability insurance for certain Livestock Exhibitors at the 2010 Adelaide Show, the following applies:-

- Insured Party:** Livestock and Animal Exhibitors participating in competitions and events
- Period of Insurance:** From seven days prior to the Show until seven days thereafter
- Insured Activities:** All activities undertaken whilst within and from the confines of the event venue consistent with the Insured's livestock exhibit activity including setting up and removal
- Description of Cover:** Insurance in respect of the Insured Party's liability to pay costs and compensation in respect of loss of or damage to third party property and death of or injury to third party persons caused by and arising out of the Insured activities, all subject to the Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Society of South Australia Inc policy terms, conditions, exclusions and warranties, etc.
- Amount of Cover:** \$10,000,000 any one occurrence
- Deductible:** \$10,000 any one occurrence
- Geographic Limits:** At and from the event venue
- Claims Payable:** Worldwide excluding claims made USA and Canada
- Insurer(s):** Certain underwriters at Lloyds of London
- Address:** London Underwriting Centre, 3 Minster Court, Mincing Lane, London EC3R 7DD
- Policy Number:** 08GC0M0430

## Important Conditions:

1. The Insured Party must exercise reasonable care to maintain all premises, fittings and plant in sound condition.
2. The Insured Party must take all reasonable precautions to prevent injury and damage to persons and property.
3. The Insured Party must give immediate notice of an incident which may give rise to a claim or of receipt of advice of a claim.
4. The Insured Party must not make any admission, offer or promise in connection with any claim and must not any time admit liability.
5. The Insured Party must make themselves aware of and comply with the following Notices:-

**Duty of Disclosure:** Before you enter into a contract of General insurance with an insurer, you have a duty, under the Insurance Contracts Act 1984 as amended, to disclose to the insurer every matter that you know, or could reasonably be expected to know, is relevant to the insurer's decision whether to accept the risk of the insurance and, if so, on what terms.
