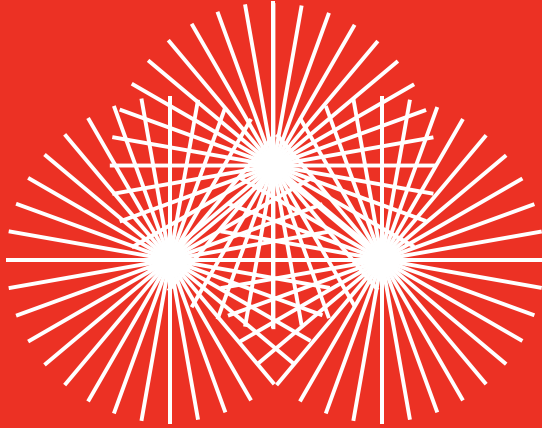

Exhibitors may place their tanks in position within the following prescribed times under supervision of the receiving steward. Under no circumstances will staging of fish be allowed after 9.00 pm on Wednesday, 1 September, except with the Supervisor's permission.

Any illegal fish or plants will be removed at the discretion of the Supervisor.

UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES WILL EXHIBITORS BE ALLOWED IN THE AQUARIA AREA ON JUDGING DAY WITHOUT PERMISSION OF THE SUPERVISOR.

REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS

Exhibitors must remove their aquaria and fish under the supervision of the Supervisor between 8.00 am and 12.00 noon on Sunday, 12 September.

FISH MAY NOT BE REMOVED AT ANY TIME AFTER STAGING WITHOUT THE SUPERVISOR'S PERMISSION. THIS REGULATION WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES

The following conditions will strictly apply:

- All entry forms and fees whether lodged in person or sent by post, must be in the Society's possession at its Administration Office by 5.00 pm on Friday 16 July.
- Postal entry forms and fees will be accepted up to and including entries postmarked on or before the official closing date
- A late entry option is offered under the following conditions:
Received or postmarked within 7 days of the official closing date.

and

an additional fee equivalent to three times the standard entry fee per class is to be paid.

- When sending entry forms and fees by post, the onus is on the exhibitor to ensure adequate delivery time.
- Entry forms by facsimile are strictly forbidden and will be destroyed.
- If you require formal acknowledgement that your entry has been received, please include a stamped, self-addressed envelope with your entry form.

WITHDRAWALS

All withdrawals must be made in writing and can be sent via email to

info@adelaideshowground.com.au or faxed to (08) 8212 1533. Emailed withdrawals must include "Withdrawal" in the subject line and the section (eg Aquarium Fish), exhibitor name, class number, exhibit number (if known) and exhibit name (if applicable). Withdrawals must be made at least 24 hours prior to judging.

PAYMENT OF FEES

When paying fees by cheque or credit card, exhibitors must ensure that sufficient funds are available at the time of entry. Failure to do so may result in non-acceptance of entries.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS

Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show and that the Special Regulations hereunder set out, which apply to this section only, are merely supplementary to and subject to these General Regulations. A copy of the General Regulations may be obtained from the Society's website | www.theshow.com.au or a copy may be obtained upon request from the Society's Administration Office.

PRIZES

Prize money will be awarded as follows:

First, \$20; second, \$10; third, \$5.

In addition, a prize ribbon will be awarded to all first, second and third prize winners.

All Champions Receive Sash and Card

PRIZE MONEY

Exhibitors may request any prize money won during the Royal Adelaide Show be paid by EFT (Electronic Funds Transfer) by completing the form provided. EFT is a more efficient payment method. Exhibitors not requesting payment by EFT will be paid by cheque.

Prize money will be paid at the end of October.

ENTRY FORMS

If two fish are entered in the same class, please state type and colour on entry form.

Photocopied entry forms will be accepted.

YOUR PRIVACY

If you do not want your details to be made available to other parties, please tick the box on the entry form supplied by the RA&HS. Your personal information will only be used by the RA&HS to maintain contact with you and allow us to manage your entries. The RA&HS reserves the right to inform prize sponsors the details of recipients to enable distribution of their voucher/product prizes to the winner.

Please note: By ticking the box to suppress your details, your name and address will not appear in the Catalogue. (if applicable)

LOCATION OF EXHIBITS

Aquarium Fish will be exhibited in the Pet Centre, located on the western side of the Showground.

EXHIBITOR PASSES

Exhibitor passes will be issued prior to showing.

Failure to exhibit will resort in cancellation.

EXHIBITS

All exhibits must be staged in the space allocated on stands supplied by the Society. If the number of entries exceeds the space available, the Society reserves the right to restrict the number of entries to those which can be accommodated.

All aquaria must be glass fronted and covered with either glass or gauze.

All aquaria must be fitted with a plain coloured backing (painting is allowed) excepting Class 42 - Novelty Fancy Dress. All aquaria must be rectangular and have a surface area of 610 mm x 305 mm with a minimum height of 355 mm or 915 mm x 356 mm with a height of 457 mm.

Exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor. Glass or plastic dividers may be used at the discretion of the exhibitor with the approval of the Supervisor.

PLEASE NOTE: Not more than one entry in any one class per aquarium.

Exhibitors must feed and service their exhibits.

The Supervisor may direct the removal of any exhibit and may remove same at his discretion if the direction is not obeyed within a reasonable time.

Any exhibitor found siphoning water onto the floor will be liable to forfeit all prize money awarded.

NOTE: Aquaria may be planted but only Classes

23, 24 and 25 will be judged for plants and plant arrangements.

Relevant standards will be applied for the purpose of establishing classes for judging. Request details from the Supervisor.

CLASSIFICATION

All classification queries to be referred to the Supervisor.

It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to ensure that exhibits are entered in the correct class for judging.

TANKS

A limited number of 24" and 36" aquariums are available. Exhibitors should indicate their desire to use these tanks (limit of one tank per exhibitor) on their entry forms. Tanks will be allotted, on a first come first serve basis, according to date of receipt of entry.

STAGING

Exhibitors may stage their fish together with their tanks concurrently if they so desire. However, all exhibitors must leave the hall at or before the closing times as prescribed above, or upon request from the Receiving Steward or Section Supervisor. Failure to comply with this regulation will mean instant disqualification. It is strongly recommended that exhibitors read the condition of entries on pages 5 and 6 of the Prize Schedule. Exhibitors are strongly advised to locate their tanks

Class 1–Veiltail, any variety.

Class 2–Fantail, black moor.

Class 3–Fantail, gold.

Class 4–Fantail, gold telescopic.

Class 5–Oranda, calico.

Class 6–Oranda, redcap.

Class 7–Oranda, red or red & white.

Class 8–Oranda, any other variety.

Class 9–Calico Fantail, telescopic.

Class 10–Calico Fantail or Ryukin, non-telescopic.

Class 11–Shubunkin, short tail variety.

Class 12–Shubunkin, long tail variety.

Class 13–Lionhead or Ranchu, red or red & white.

COMPETITIVE EXHIBITORS
Conditions of Entry

RISK MANAGEMENT HAZARD REPORTING

Competitors must notify the Area/Pavilion Supervisor or the Venue Management Office immediately of any hazards detected. Hazards are any situation that could result in:

1. Injury, illness or death to people or animals
2. Damage or destruction to property

INCIDENT REPORTING

Competitors must notify the Area/Pavilion Supervisor or the Venue Management Office immediately an incident occurs which has resulted in:

1. The injury, illness or death of any person or animal
2. The damage, destruction or loss of property
3. A near miss incident that could have resulted in the consequences listed in 1 and 2

WASTE DISPOSAL

All waste including liquids must be disposed of responsibly. Storm drains must not be used for the disposal of any waste.

HAZARD MINIMISATION

All areas must be kept in a clean and tidy order with clearly defined and available access and exit routes at all times. Build up of combustible waste must be avoided.

Care must be taken to minimise trip hazards and obstacles that people may walk into. Avoid laying unprotected cables or pipes on or above paths, walkways or roads.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

The RA & HS are to be advised of all hazardous materials that are to be brought onto the Showground. Appropriate warning signs and Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) will need to be provided before allowing these materials on site.

MEDIA COMMENTS

Any public comment on emergencies, incidents or other venue matters should only come from the RA&HS. The key media spokesperson for the RA&HS is the Marketing Manager.

DUTY OF CARE

All competitors have a "Duty of Care" to avoid exposing themselves or other people to situations which could lead to injury. This "Duty of Care" extends to the prevention of damage to property.

LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY

1. Release
Entry to and remaining on the Showground is entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor and to the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor releases the Society (which term includes in this clause the Society's officers, employees, members and agents), from all claims and demands of every kind resulting from any accident, damage or injury occurring at the Showground, and without limitation, the Exhibitor acknowledges:
 - (a) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any Exhibit;
 - (b) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees and Agents;
 - (c) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to a Motor Vehicle or any of its contents whilst it is located on the Showground; and
 - (d) without limiting Regulations 1 (a) and 1 (b) above, the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury resulting from the sale, treatment, failure to treat, destruction, disposal or other dealing with any Exhibit, or for loss, damage or injury to any personal belongings, equipment or property brought onto the Showground.
2. Indemnity
To the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor must indemnify and keep indemnified the Society and its officers, employees, members and agents from and against all actions, claims, demands, losses, damages, costs, expenses and liabilities including without limitation, consequential loss and loss of profits for which the Society is or may be or become liable in respect of or arising from:
 - (a) loss, damage or injury to any person in connection with the Exhibit or the relevant Event;
 - (b) without limiting Regulation 2(a), loss, damage or injury to any other Exhibit or Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees, Agents, or to the property of the Society, or its members, or to the general public, caused or contributed to or by any act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents; and

COMPETITIVE EXHIBITORS

Conditions of Entry

- (c) without limiting Regulation 2(a), loss, damage or injury to the Exhibit, or the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees, or Agents caused or contributed by an act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the transportation, feeding or housing of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor.
3. Removal from Showground
Without prejudice to any other provision in these Regulations, where the Society, its officers, employees members or agents removes an Exhibit, or causes an Exhibit to be removed from the Showground, the Exhibit is removed or caused to be removed entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor. The person or persons removing the Exhibit will be deemed to be the agent of the Exhibitor, and his or her acts and omissions will be deemed to be the acts and omissions of the Exhibitor.
4. Insurance
The Society will arrange compulsory Owner's Liability insurance cover for all Exhibitors of Exhibits being animals. The Exhibitor is bound by the terms and conditions of this insurance and by Statutory Duties as defined under the Insurance Contracts Act (1984). Details of the Compulsory Owner's Liability insurance are set out in the Relevant Schedule
5. Personal effects
The Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss or damage caused to personal belongings, equipment or property which is brought onto the Showground by an Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents.

EMERGENCY INFORMATION

Emergency information and Emergency Assembly Points for the various animal pavilions and stables will be included with Exhibitor Entry Detail Returns and Notice to Exhibitor mail outs. Competitors should be familiar with these plans.

FIRST AID

During the Royal Adelaide Show, St John Ambulance provides First Aid Services but it is suggested that competitors have a basic First Aid kit if minor injuries are a possibility.

RA&HS EMERGENCY FACILITIES

Fire fighting and other emergency equipment must not be removed or used for any other purpose. Missing or unserviceable equipment should be reported to the Venue Management Office immediately.

SMOKING

The RA&HS Smoking Code does not permit smoking inside buildings, within 10 metres of a building entrance, around combustibles, during public performances or while handling hazardous materials.

TRAFFIC CONTROL

The RA&HS Traffic Control Code imposes speed restrictions within the Showground. For the duration of the Royal Adelaide Show the speed limit is 10 kph. The use of vehicles inside the Showground is closely managed during the Royal Adelaide Show. Conditions of entry will be provided with the issue of Vehicle Entry Permits.

ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

1. Competitors should supply their own "Safety Switch" (RCD) for installation at each power outlet they use.
2. Extension cords must be earthed and all electrical appliances must be earthed or double insulated. Appliances must be in sound working order and safety tagged.
3. Power boards with overload protection can only be used at the discretion of the Venue Services Manager.
4. The use of double adaptors is strictly prohibited.
5. Appliances and power cables must not be used or laid through any area that may become wet.
6. Power cables must not be laid across walkways, paths, roads or any area where damage could occur to the cable.
7. Bar (resistance) heaters must not be used.
8. Light sockets must not be used for any other purpose than for lighting.

Livestock & Animal Exhibitors Public Liability Insurance Explanation

WHEREAS Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Society of South Australia Inc has agreed to effect a Public Liability insurance for certain Livestock Exhibitors at the 2010 Adelaide Show, the following applies:-

Insured Party:	Livestock and Animal Exhibitors participating in competitions and events
Period of Insurance:	From seven days prior to the Show until seven days thereafter
Insured Activities:	All activities undertaken whilst within and from the confines of the event venue consistent with the Insured's livestock exhibit activity including setting up and removal
Description of Cover:	Insurance in respect of the Insured Party's liability to pay costs and compensation in respect of loss of or damage to third party property and death of or injury to third party persons caused by and arising out of the Insured activities, all subject to the Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Society of South Australia Inc policy terms, conditions, exclusions and warranties, etc.
Amount of Cover:	\$10,000,000 any one occurrence
Deductible:	\$10,000 any one occurrence
Geographic Limits:	At and from the event venue
Claims Payable:	Worldwide excluding claims made USA and Canada
Insurer(s):	Certain underwriters at Lloyds of London
Address:	London Underwriting Centre, 3 Minster Court, Mincing Lane, London EC3R 7DD
Policy Number:	08GC0M0430

Important Conditions:

1. The Insured Party must exercise reasonable care to maintain all premises, fittings and plant in sound condition.
2. The Insured Party must take all reasonable precautions to prevent injury and damage to persons and property.
3. The Insured Party must give immediate notice of an incident which may give rise to a claim or of receipt of advice of a claim.
4. The Insured Party must not make any admission, offer or promise in connection with any claim and must not any time admit liability.
5. The Insured Party must made themselves aware of and comply with the following Notices:-

Duty of Disclosure: Before you enter into a contract of General insurance with an insurer, you have a duty, under the Insurance Contracts Act 1984 as amended, to disclose to the insurer every matter that you know, or could reasonably be expected to know, is relevant to the insurer's decision whether to accept the risk of the insurance and, if so, on what terms.

You have the same duty to disclose these matters to the insurer before you renew, extend, vary or reinstate a contract of General insurance.

Your duty however, does not require disclosure of matter:-

- * that diminishes the risk to be undertaken by the insurer
- * that is of common knowledge
- * that your insurer knows or, in the ordinary course of his business, ought to know.

Livestock & Animal Exhibitors Public Liability Insurance Explanation

Non-Disclosure: If you fail to comply with your duty of disclosure, the insurer may be entitled to reduce his liability under the contract in respect of a claim or may cancel the contract.

If your non-disclosure is fraudulent, the insurer may also have the option of avoiding the contract from its beginning.

Average Provision: The insurer will pay legal expenses in addition to the sum insured, if however, the total amount of the loss (less legal expenses) ultimately paid to the claimant(s) exceeds the sum insured then insurers will only pay (in addition to the sum insured) that proportion of the legal expenses as the sum insured bears to the loss.

Third Party Interests: This policy will only provide cover for your interest and does not cover the interests of any third party (e.g. financiers, lessors, etc) unless the interests of the third party are noted in the policy.

Waiver of Insurer's Rights: You must not enter into any agreement without the written authority of the insurer whereby any of their rights to which they become entitled as your insurer after settling or agreeing to settle a claim are prejudiced or limited in any way otherwise all benefit under the policy will be forfeited.

5. Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Society of South Australia Inc is not providing financial product advice, has not considered the particular needs of the Insured party and no statement is intended to influence a person or persons making a decision in relation to any insurance cover.
6. THIS INSURANCE ONLY APPLIES TO INSURED PARTIES ENTERING COMPETITION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE GENERAL REGULATIONS.
