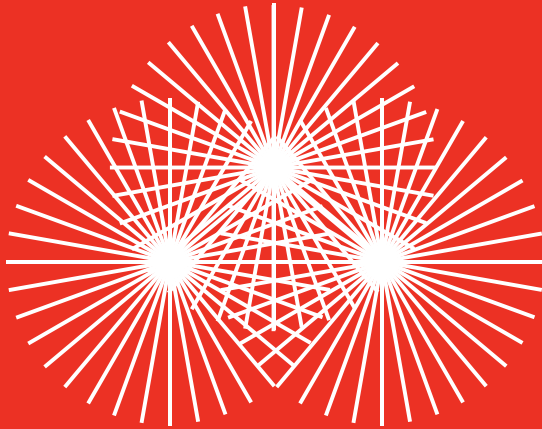

CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES

- The following conditions will strictly apply:
- All entry forms, whether lodged in person or sent by post, or completed on-line must be in the Society's possession at its Administration Office by 5.00 pm on Friday, 16 July 2010.
- Postal entry forms and fees will be accepted up to and including entries postmarked on or before the official closing date.
- A late entry option is offered under the following conditions:
Received or postmarked within 7 days of the official closing date *and* an additional fee equivalent to three times the standard entry fee per class is to be paid.
- When sending entry forms and fees by post, the onus is on the exhibitor to ensure adequate delivery time.
- Entry forms by facsimile will not be accepted.
- If you require formal acknowledgement that your entry has been received, please include a stamped, self-addressed envelope with your entry form.
- **Absolutely no exception to the above conditions will be made to any exhibitor under any circumstance.**

SPECIAL REGULATIONS

Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show and that the Special Regulations hereunder set out, which apply to this section only, are merely supplementary to these General Regulations. A copy of the General Regulations may be obtained from the Society's website at www.theshow.com.au or upon request from the Society's Administration Office.

PRIZES

Prize cards will be awarded for first, second and third prize in each section of each class and Best of Breed.

Prize ribbons will be awarded for first, second and third prize in each section of each class.

In addition, rosettes will be awarded to major winners with ribbons being presented to other special award winners.

LOCATION OF EXHIBITS

Cavies will be exhibited in the Pet Centre located on the western side of the Showground.

JUDGING DAY

Cavies will be judged at 9.00 am on Saturday, 11 September.

The hall will be open to the public during judging. Cavies will be on exhibition on the judging day only until 5.00 pm.

ENTRY FORMS

Each exhibitor must fill in a separate entry form. Exhibitors will be issued with a one day pass. An additional pass will be issued to those exhibitors showing more than 10 Cavies. Birthdate must be supplied or animal will be entered in Adult Class.

If this information is not supplied the animal may be entered into the Open class for this Breed.

1. To complete the entry form, place the number of the class you are entering in the CLASS NO. column.
2. The SECTION column is for stating whether the cavy is a BOAR (9 months and over); SOW (9 months and over); INTERMEDIATE (6 to 8 months inclusive), YOUNG (3 to 5 months inclusive.)
3. In the NAME column please state name and stud.

4. For entries in CONDITION CLASSES, please state if BOAR or SOW.
5. NOVICE CONDITION PET CLASS is for cavies not having won a first place in this class.
6. OPEN CONDITION PET CLASS is for cavies that have won a first place.
There are two age groups for these classes: YOUNG – 3 months to 8 months.
ADULT – 9 months and over.
7. BEGINNERS CONDITION EXHIBIT is for exhibitors who have been showing cavies for less than 12 months.

THE FOLLOWING RULES ARE TO BE OBSERVED

1. All cavies exhibited at the Show must be fed by the exhibitor only. Cavies may be fed at the owner's discretion.
2. Cavies must be at the hall from 8.30 am. No person, except the owner or their representative, will be allowed in the hall until after the cavy has been benched. Any cavy which shows symptoms of any disease, is lice infested and/or dirty must be removed from the Showground immediately.
3. No cavy shall be removed from the hall between the hours of 9.00 am and 5.00 pm unless a veterinary certificate be produced stating that the cavy is not fit to remain on the bench. In the event that a veterinary certificate cannot be obtained a cavy who is showing signs of distress or illness may be removed by the exhibitor with permission from the Show Convenor.
4. Pickup of cavies will commence at 5.00 pm on Saturday, 11 September.
5. No cavy shall be removed unless a "PASS OUT" is obtained from the Show Convenor. Pass outs will only be issued for medical or health reasons pertaining to the welfare of the cavy.
6. **No cavy shall be removed from the cages during the Show, except by their owners. The nominated Stewards may remove cavies from the cages for the purpose of presenting them for judging.**
7. The Society will not, under any circumstances, hold itself responsible for any loss or misdelivery of livestock or other exhibits at the Society's exhibition, or any damage thereto.
8. If any exhibits are not in their cages when the judges are called to the floor, the exhibits will be automatically disqualified.
9. No cavy which is pregnant, nursing or sick shall be exhibited.
10. NO SUBSTITUTIONS of entries will be allowed.
11. **NO sawdust or hay is to be put in show cages. Exhibitors may place towels, cat litter or carpet squares in their show cages.**

Use of towels or "snuggle bags" to calm distressed or anxious cavies is permitted in the interests of the welfare of the cavy.

12. NO cavy to be artificially coloured.
NO cutting or trimming of longhairs.
13. Cavies purchased from a cavy judge cannot be exhibited before that judge within 3 months of purchase date.
14. All cavies must be exhibited in a carry cage.

PENALTY FOR NON-EXHIBITION OF CAVIES

In order to prevent the non-exhibition of animals which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparation, expense and disarrangement of the Show Yard, any persons making an entry shall be liable to a fine of \$2 in respect of each cavy not exhibited, unless a certificate under the hand of the exhibitor or his authorised agent is lodged with the Director of the Society before the day of exhibition to the effect that such non-exhibition is caused either by

- (1) the death of the animal or animals; or
- (2) contagious or infectious disease (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or
- (3) by its becoming ineligible for the class in which it has been entered, or other reasonable cause. The non-payment of such will debar all persons from exhibiting at future exhibitions of the Society.

SICK OR DISEASED ANIMALS

If in the opinion of a qualified veterinary surgeon appointed by the Society, a cavy on the Showground is so injured or affected by sickness, disease or other ailment as to warrant its destruction or removal from the Showground, the Society shall be entitled to have the cavy destroyed and/or require it to be removed immediately from the Showground. If the exhibitor fails to respond to a request to remove a cavy, the Society may do so and any costs of removal will be borne by the Exhibitor.

BEST PET IN SHOW

Livestock & Animal Exhibitors Public Liability Insurance Explanation

WHEREAS Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Society of South Australia Inc has agreed to effect a Public Liability insurance for certain Livestock Exhibitors at the 2010 Adelaide Show, the following applies:-

Insured Party:	Livestock and Animal Exhibitors participating in competitions and events
Period of Insurance:	From seven days prior to the Show until seven days thereafter
Insured Activities:	All activities undertaken whilst within and from the confines of the event venue consistent with the Insured's livestock exhibit activity including setting up and removal
Description of Cover:	Insurance in respect of the Insured Party's liability to pay costs and compensation in respect of loss of or damage to third party property and death of or injury to third party persons caused by and arising out of the Insured activities, all subject to the Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Society of South Australia Inc policy terms, conditions, exclusions and warranties, etc.
Amount of Cover:	\$10,000,000 any one occurrence
Deductible:	\$10,000 any one occurrence
Geographic Limits:	At and from the event venue
Claims Payable:	Worldwide excluding claims made USA and Canada
Insurer(s):	Certain underwriters at Lloyds of London
Address:	London Underwriting Centre, 3 Minster Court, Mincing Lane, London EC3R 7DD
Policy Number:	08GC0M0430

Important Conditions:

1. The Insured Party must exercise reasonable care to maintain all premises, fittings and plant in sound condition.
2. The Insured Party must take all reasonable precautions to prevent injury and damage to persons and property.
3. The Insured Party must give immediate notice of an incident which may give rise to a claim or of receipt of advice of a claim.
4. The Insured Party must not make any admission, offer or promise in connection with any claim and must not any time admit liability.
5. The Insured Party must made themselves aware of and comply with the following Notices:-

Duty of Disclosure: Before you enter into a contract of General insurance with an insurer, you have a duty, under the Insurance Contracts Act 1984 as amended, to disclose to the insurer every matter that you know, or could reasonably be expected to know, is relevant to the insurer's decision whether to accept the risk of the insurance and, if so, on what terms.

You have the same duty to disclose these matters to the insurer before you renew, extend, vary or reinstate a contract of General insurance.

Your duty however, does not require disclosure of matter:-

- * that diminishes the risk to be undertaken by the insurer
- * that is of common knowledge
- * that your insurer knows or, in the ordinary course of his business, ought to know.

Livestock & Animal Exhibitors Public Liability Insurance Explanation

Non-Disclosure: If you fail to comply with your duty of disclosure, the insurer may be entitled to reduce his liability under the contract in respect of a claim or may cancel the contract.

If your non-disclosure is fraudulent, the insurer may also have the option of avoiding the contract from its beginning.

Average Provision: The insurer will pay legal expenses in addition to the sum insured, if however, the total amount of the loss (less legal expenses) ultimately paid to the claimant(s) exceeds the sum insured then insurers will only pay (in addition to the sum insured) that proportion of the legal expenses as the sum insured bears to the loss.

Third Party Interests: This policy will only provide cover for your interest and does not cover the interests of any third party (e.g. financiers, lessors, etc) unless the interests of the third party are noted in the policy.

Waiver of Insurer's Rights: You must not enter into any agreement without the written authority of the insurer whereby any of their rights to which they become entitled as your insurer after settling or agreeing to settle a claim are prejudiced or limited in any way otherwise all benefit under the policy will be forfeited.

5. Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Society of South Australia Inc is not providing financial product advice, has not considered the particular needs of the Insured party and no statement is intended to influence a person or persons making a decision in relation to any insurance cover.
6. THIS INSURANCE ONLY APPLIES TO INSURED PARTIES ENTERING COMPETITION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE GENERAL REGULATIONS.

COMPETITIVE EXHIBITORS

Conditions of Entry

RISK MANAGEMENT HAZARD REPORTING

Competitors must notify the Area/Pavilion Supervisor or the Venue Management Office immediately of any hazards detected. Hazards are any situation that could result in:

1. Injury, illness or death to people or animals
2. Damage or destruction to property

INCIDENT REPORTING

Competitors must notify the Area/Pavilion Supervisor or the Venue Management Office immediately an incident occurs which has resulted in:

1. The injury, illness or death of any person or animal
2. The damage, destruction or loss of property
3. A near miss incident that could have resulted in the consequences listed in 1 and 2

WASTE DISPOSAL

All waste including liquids must be disposed of responsibly. Storm drains must not be used for the disposal of any waste.

HAZARD MINIMISATION

All areas must be kept in a clean and tidy order with clearly defined and available access and exit routes at all times. Build up of combustible waste must be avoided.

Care must be taken to minimise trip hazards and obstacles that people may walk into. Avoid laying unprotected cables or pipes on or above paths, walkways or roads.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

The RA & HS are to be advised of all hazardous materials that are to be brought onto the Showground. Appropriate warning signs and Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) will need to be provided before allowing these materials on site.

MEDIA COMMENTS

Any public comment on emergencies, incidents or other venue matters should only come from the RA&HS. The key media spokesperson for the RA&HS is the Marketing Manager.

DUTY OF CARE

All competitors have a "Duty of Care" to avoid exposing themselves or other people to situations which could lead to injury. This "Duty of Care" extends to the prevention of damage to property.

LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY

1. Release

Entry to and remaining on the Showground is entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor and to the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor releases the Society (which term includes in this clause the Society's officers, employees, members and agents), from all claims and demands of every kind resulting from any accident, damage or injury occurring at the Showground, and without limitation, the Exhibitor acknowledges:

- (a) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any Exhibit;
- (b) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees and Agents;
- (c) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to a Motor Vehicle or any of its contents whilst it is located on the Showground; and
- (d) without limiting Regulations 1 (a) and 1 (b) above, the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury resulting from the sale, treatment, failure to treat, destruction, disposal or other dealing with any Exhibit, or for loss, damage or injury to any personal belongings, equipment or property brought onto the Showground.

2. Indemnity

To the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor must indemnify and keep indemnified the Society and its officers, employees, members and agents from and against all actions, claims, demands, losses, damages, costs, expenses and liabilities including without limitation, consequential loss and loss of profits for which the Society is or may be or become liable in respect of or arising from:

- (a) loss, damage or injury to any person in connection with the Exhibit or the relevant Event;
- (b) without limiting Regulation 2(a), loss, damage or injury to any other Exhibit or Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees, Agents, or to the property of the Society, or its members, or to the general public, caused or contributed to or by any act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents; and

COMPETITIVE EXHIBITORS

Conditions of Entry

- (c) without limiting Regulation 2(a), loss, damage or injury to the Exhibit, or the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees, or Agents caused or contributed by an act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the transportation, feeding or housing of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor.
3. Removal from Showground
Without prejudice to any other provision in these Regulations, where the Society, its officers, employees members or agents removes an Exhibit, or causes an Exhibit to be removed from the Showground, the Exhibit is removed or caused to be removed entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor. The person or persons removing the Exhibit will be deemed to be the agent of the Exhibitor, and his or her acts and omissions will be deemed to be the acts and omissions of the Exhibitor.
4. Insurance
The Society will arrange compulsory Owner's Liability insurance cover for all Exhibitors of Exhibits being animals. The Exhibitor is bound by the terms and conditions of this insurance and by Statutory Duties as defined under the Insurance Contracts Act (1984). Details of the Compulsory Owner's Liability insurance are set out in the Relevant Schedule
5. Personal effects
The Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss or damage caused to personal belongings, equipment or property which is brought onto the Showground by an Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents.

EMERGENCY INFORMATION

Emergency information and Emergency Assembly Points for the various animal pavilions and stables will be included with Exhibitor Entry Detail Returns and Notice to Exhibitor mail outs. Competitors should be familiar with these plans.

FIRST AID

During the Royal Adelaide Show, St John Ambulance provides First Aid Services but it is suggested that competitors have a basic First Aid kit if minor injuries are a possibility.

RA&HS EMERGENCY FACILITIES

Fire fighting and other emergency equipment must not be removed or used for any other purpose. Missing or unserviceable equipment should be reported to the Venue Management Office immediately.

SMOKING

The RA&HS Smoking Code does not permit smoking inside buildings, within 10 metres of a building entrance, around combustibles, during public performances or while handling hazardous materials.

TRAFFIC CONTROL

The RA&HS Traffic Control Code imposes speed restrictions within the Showground. For the duration of the Royal Adelaide Show the speed limit is 10 kph. The use of vehicles inside the Showground is closely managed during the Royal Adelaide Show. Conditions of entry will be provided with the issue of Vehicle Entry Permits.

ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

1. Competitors should supply their own "Safety Switch" (RCD) for installation at each power outlet they use.
2. Extension cords must be earthed and all electrical appliances must be earthed or double insulated. Appliances must be in sound working order and safety tagged.
3. Power boards with overload protection can only be used at the discretion of the Venue Services Manager.
4. The use of double adaptors is strictly prohibited.
5. Appliances and power cables must not be used or laid through any area that may become wet.
6. Power cables must not be laid across walkways, paths, roads or any area where damage could occur to the cable.
7. Bar (resistance) heaters must not be used.
8. Light sockets must not be used for any other purpose than for lighting.
