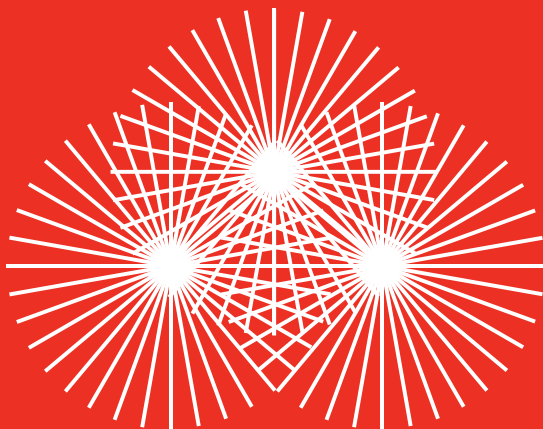

# 2010 CAT COMPETITION

## ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE TIMES

Departure: 5.15 pm

Cats MUST be benched and pavilion cleared by 8.30 am on the day on which they are to be judged.

Re-admittance for the collection of Cats will be at 5.00 pm with the Cat Section of the Pet Centre closing at 5.15 pm sharp. Judging will commence at 8.45 am.

## JUDGES PROFILE



Annette Joesbury has been involved with the cat fancy since 1972 breeding Persians; firstly Chinchillas, self colours, colourpoints and brown tabbies. Following on to this she began breeding Exotic Shorthairs. She started judging Persians back in 1985 and then 14 years ago became an all breeds judge. Annette is a CCCA judge and a tutor judge in Western Australia.

For the past 7 years Annette has been breeding Munchkins. She has found this to be a challenging fight for the National Recognition of this new breed but finds it has been well worth while.

In the past Annette has judged in South Australia, Victoria, Tasmania and New Zealand. While abroad she has also attended numerous cat shows in the UK and the USA allowing her to handle the new breeds.

### CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES

**The following conditions will strictly apply:**

- All entry forms, whether lodged in person or sent by post, or completed on-line must be in the Society's possession at its Administration Office by 5.00 pm on Friday, 25 June 2010.
- Postal entry forms and fees will be accepted up to and including entries postmarked on or before the official closing date.
- A late entry option is offered under the following conditions:  
Received or postmarked within 7 days of the official closing date *and* an additional fee equivalent to three times the standard entry fee per class is to be paid.
- When sending entry forms and fees by post, the onus is on the exhibitor to ensure adequate delivery time.
- Entry forms by facsimile will not be accepted.
- If you require formal acknowledgement that your entry has been received, please include a stamped, self-addressed envelope with your entry form.
- **Absolutely no exception to the above conditions will be made to any exhibitor under any circumstance.**

### MEMBERSHIP

Exhibitors need not be members of the Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Society of SA Inc (hereafter referred to as RA&HS), but members are entitled to a reduced entry fee.

Membership fees: Adults \$125, Juniors (under 18) as at 1 January 2010, \$42.

### LOCATION OF EXHIBITS

Cats will be exhibited in the Pet Centre on the western side of the Showground. Exhibitors will be advised of arrival and departure details when the "Notice to Exhibitors" is posted out.

### EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE

As there is a limit to the number of cats that can be accommodated in the present venue, entries will be determined strictly according to the date of receipt. If numbers are too large, some exhibits may be moved to another day. Exhibitors will be notified of any change.

### ENTRY TO SHOWGROUND

Exhibitors entering 1-2 exhibits will receive one day entry pass.

Three or more exhibits will receive 2 day entry passes.

One additional day pass only will be issued by the Supervisor to exhibitors returning for judging on Saturday, 11 September.

Additional exhibitor admission passes may be purchased when submitting entries. See entry form for pricing.

### AWARDS

No prize will be awarded unless the exhibit is, in the opinion of the judge, worthy.

Prize Cards will be awarded.

Special awards will be allotted to classes where entries warrant it.

RA&HS rosettes will be awarded to the Top Ten Best Exhibit in Show and sash for Best Domestic or Part Pedigreed Exhibit in Show.

Challenge ribbons will also be awarded.

Trophy donations from Clubs and Individuals will be acknowledged in the Catalogue.

It would be appreciated if all trophies were delivered to the Administration Office at the Showground or to one of the Section Supervisors at least 10 days prior to the opening day of the Show.

### MERIT CERTIFICATE

A merit certificate may be awarded to the winning entry in the domestic and part Pedigree neuter male and neuter female classes if recommended by the judge.

**CHALLENGE CERTIFICATES**

A challenge certificate may be awarded to the winning entries in the open, championship, grand championship and double grand championship classes of each breed (except in any other variety or provisional breeds) if recommended by the judge.

A challenge certificate may be awarded to the winning entries in the neuter, premier neuter, grand premier neuter and double grand premier neuter classes of each breed (except in any other variety or provisional breeds) if recommended by the judge.

Any breed or colour not listed under the breeds section can be entered as an AOV.

**MAJOR AWARD WINNERS**

Cats winning major awards will be required to be exhibited on the last day. Exhibitors must bring their original slip for vetting-in. Failure to attend will result in forfeiture of awards.

Interstate and far distant South Australian exhibits are able to apply for exemption from returning on the last day. Arrangements for exemption must be made with the Cat Supervisor prior to the last day.

**SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES**

The cat's name, registered number, council where registered, date of birth, sire and dam, breed, colour and breeder must be stated on the entry form.

**Exhibitors must be the registered owner/lessee of the exhibit.**

Specify exact colour description of each cat, e.g. Blue Tabby Point, Brown Spotted Tabby British etc., as there are separate challenge classes for colours.

Kittens can only be entered in kitten classes.

**UPGRADES**

Exhibitors must notify the Society by Friday, 27 August 2010 of any change of status. There will be no re-classing or change of status on the day of showing.

**REGISTRATIONS**

All cats or kittens domiciled in South Australia, except domestics, must be registered with either FASA or GCCFSA.

Interstate exhibits must be registered within their own State of domicile with a recognised council.

Kittens over five months and cats/kittens within three months of transfer from interstate must be registered with FASA or GCCFSA.

All kittens must be litter registered.

**AGE OF ANIMALS**

The age of all cats will be the actual age on the judging day (month refers to calendar month). If because the Show is over nine days this causes ineligibility, then the exhibit must be entered in the younger age group.

**EXHIBITS**

**No cat shall be removed between the hours of 7.30 am and 5.15 pm unless a veterinary certificate is produced stating that the cat is not fit to remain on the Showground.**

It is recommended that cats be exhibited with all claws clipped. Domestic cats and part pedigreed cats must be desexed by the age of six months.

Prior to judging, there shall be no interior or exterior distinguishing objects. Plain white or coloured curtains and blankets are permissible.

Litter trays will be allowed in cages during judging. Trays must be unidentifiable. Double cages will not be available. The cages will be 535 mm x 535 mm.

No cat or kitten shall be removed during the time it is on exhibition for any purpose whatsoever without the authority of the supervisor.

The Society will under no circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss or misdelivery of exhibits, or any injury thereto.

**VETERINARY INSPECTION**

All cats must arrive by 7.30 am on judging days for examination by the Society's veterinary surgeon. If approved, cats must be benched at once. No person, except the owner or his representatives, will be allowed in the pavilion until after the cats have been examined and benched. Any cat which shows symptoms of any disease, is lice infested and/or dirty, must be removed from the Showground immediately.

If any exhibit is rejected on the grounds of infectious or contagious disease, then no other exhibits from that cattery may be shown.

The vet's decision is final.

**UNATTENDED EXHIBITS**

If an exhibit is to be left unattended whilst on show Stewards & Officials must be made aware. Stewards and Officials may tend to unattended exhibits as deemed necessary.

## UNAUTHORISED REMOVAL OF CATS

**No cat will be permitted to leave the Showground before the time set down for its removal, unless the owner produces a certificate signed by the Society's veterinary surgeon signifying that the animal be removed for reason of health or condition.**

**Removal of cats before the stipulated time of departure will render the owners and cats liable to disqualification.**

## WITHDRAWALS/FAILURE TO EXHIBIT

Every cat entered must be exhibited unless a certificate signed by the exhibitor or his authorised agent is lodged with the Society before the day of exhibition stating that the animal is unable to compete for one of the following reasons:

1. The cat has died;
2. The cat is unfit for exhibition due to injury or disease (confirmed by veterinary surgeon's certificate);
3. The cat has become ineligible for the class entered;
4. The cat is 28 days or more pregnant;
5. Some other cause which the Society considers reasonable.

**Exhibitors must notify the Show Society Supervisors of any cats or kittens that will not be exhibited at least 24 hours before the day of exhibition.**

**Failure to comply with this rule will render the exhibitor liable to a fine of \$15 for each cat not exhibited.** Non-payment of these fines may debar such persons from exhibiting at future Royal Adelaide Shows.

Entire and Neuter Kittens compete together.

### CAT

Entire exhibit nine months and over on day of Show.

### OPEN

All cats except champions, grand champions and double grand champions.

### CHAMPION

A cat that has qualified for the title of champion.

### GRAND CHAMPION

A cat that has qualified for the title of grand champion.

### DOUBLE GRAND CHAMPION

A cat that has qualified for the title of Double Grand Champion.

### NEUTER

A cat or kitten that is not entire.

### PREMIER NEUTER

A neuter that has qualified for the title of premier neuter or champion neuter.

### GRAND PREMIER NEUTER

A premier neuter that has qualified for the title of grand premier neuter or grand champion neuter.

### DOUBLE GRAND PREMIER NEUTER.

A cat that has qualified for the title of Double Grand Premier Neuter.

### JUNIOR

Exhibit over nine months and under eighteen months on day of Show.

### SENIOR

Exhibit over eighteen months and under seven years on day of Show.

### VETERAN

Exhibit over seven years on day of Show.

### DOMESTIC

A cat or kitten from non-pedigreed parents.

### PART PEDIGREED

A cat or kitten with one parent known to be pedigreed and named.

## COMPETITIVE EXHIBITORS

### Conditions of Entry

#### RISK MANAGEMENT HAZARD REPORTING

Competitors must notify the Area/Pavilion Supervisor or the Venue Management Office immediately of any hazards detected. Hazards are any situation that could result in:

1. Injury, illness or death to people or animals
2. Damage or destruction to property

#### INCIDENT REPORTING

Competitors must notify the Area/Pavilion Supervisor or the Venue Management Office immediately an incident occurs which has resulted in:

1. The injury, illness or death of any person or animal
2. The damage, destruction or loss of property
3. A near miss incident that could have resulted in the consequences listed in 1 and 2

#### WASTE DISPOSAL

All waste including liquids must be disposed of responsibly. Storm drains must not be used for the disposal of any waste.

#### HAZARD MINIMISATION

All areas must be kept in a clean and tidy order with clearly defined and available access and exit routes at all times. Build up of combustible waste must be avoided.

Care must be taken to minimise trip hazards and obstacles that people may walk into. Avoid laying unprotected cables or pipes on or above paths, walkways or roads.

#### HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

The RA & HS are to be advised of all hazardous materials that are to be brought onto the Showground. Appropriate warning signs and Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) will need to be provided before allowing these materials on site.

#### MEDIA COMMENTS

Any public comment on emergencies, incidents or other venue matters should only come from the RA&HS. The key media spokesperson for the RA&HS is the Marketing Manager.

#### DUTY OF CARE

All competitors have a "Duty of Care" to avoid exposing themselves or other people to situations which could lead to injury. This "Duty of Care" extends to the prevention of damage to property.

#### LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY

##### 1. Release

Entry to and remaining on the Showground is entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor and to the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor releases the Society (which term includes in this clause the Society's officers, employees, members and agents), from all claims and demands of every kind resulting from any accident, damage or injury occurring at the Showground, and without limitation, the Exhibitor acknowledges:

- (a) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any Exhibit;
- (b) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees and Agents;
- (c) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to a Motor Vehicle or any of its contents whilst it is located on the Showground; and
- (d) without limiting Regulations 1 (a) and 1 (b) above, the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury resulting from the sale, treatment, failure to treat, destruction, disposal or other dealing with any Exhibit, or for loss, damage or injury to any personal belongings, equipment or property brought onto the Showground.

##### 2. Indemnity

To the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor must indemnify and keep indemnified the Society and its officers, employees, members and agents from and against all actions, claims, demands, losses, damages, costs, expenses and liabilities including without limitation, consequential loss and loss of profits for which the Society is or may be or become liable in respect of or arising from:

- (a) loss, damage or injury to any person in connection with the Exhibit or the relevant Event;
- (b) without limiting Regulation 2(a), loss, damage or injury to any other Exhibit or Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees, Agents, or to the property of the Society, or its members, or to the general public, caused or contributed to or by any act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents; and

## COMPETITIVE EXHIBITORS

### Conditions of Entry

- (c) without limiting Regulation 2(a), loss, damage or injury to the Exhibit, or the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees, or Agents caused or contributed by an act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the transportation, feeding or housing of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor.
3. Removal from Showground  
Without prejudice to any other provision in these Regulations, where the Society, its officers, employees members or agents removes an Exhibit, or causes an Exhibit to be removed from the Showground, the Exhibit is removed or caused to be removed entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor. The person or persons removing the Exhibit will be deemed to be the agent of the Exhibitor, and his or her acts and omissions will be deemed to be the acts and omissions of the Exhibitor.
4. Insurance  
The Society will arrange compulsory Owner's Liability insurance cover for all Exhibitors of Exhibits being animals. The Exhibitor is bound by the terms and conditions of this insurance and by Statutory Duties as defined under the Insurance Contracts Act (1984). Details of the Compulsory Owner's Liability insurance are set out in the Relevant Schedule
5. Personal effects  
The Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss or damage caused to personal belongings, equipment or property which is brought onto the Showground by an Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents.

#### EMERGENCY INFORMATION

Emergency information and Emergency Assembly Points for the various animal pavilions and stables will be included with Exhibitor Entry Detail Returns and Notice to Exhibitor mail outs. Competitors should be familiar with these plans.

#### FIRST AID

During the Royal Adelaide Show, St John Ambulance provides First Aid Services but it is suggested that competitors have a basic First Aid kit if minor injuries are a possibility.

#### RA&HS EMERGENCY FACILITIES

Fire fighting and other emergency equipment must not be removed or used for any other purpose. Missing or unserviceable equipment should be reported to the Venue Management Office immediately.

#### SMOKING

The RA&HS Smoking Code does not permit smoking inside buildings, within 10 metres of a building entrance, around combustibles, during public performances or while handling hazardous materials.

#### TRAFFIC CONTROL

The RA&HS Traffic Control Code imposes speed restrictions within the Showground. For the duration of the Royal Adelaide Show the speed limit is 10 kph. The use of vehicles inside the Showground is closely managed during the Royal Adelaide Show. Conditions of entry will be provided with the issue of Vehicle Entry Permits.

#### ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

1. Competitors should supply their own "Safety Switch" (RCD) for installation at each power outlet they use.
2. Extension cords must be earthed and all electrical appliances must be earthed or double insulated. Appliances must be in sound working order and safety tagged.
3. Power boards with overload protection can only be used at the discretion of the Venue Services Manager.
4. The use of double adaptors is strictly prohibited.
5. Appliances and power cables must not be used or laid through any area that may become wet.
6. Power cables must not be laid across walkways, paths, roads or any area where damage could occur to the cable.
7. Bar (resistance) heaters must not be used.
8. Light sockets must not be used for any other purpose than for lighting.

# Livestock & Animal Exhibitors Public Liability Insurance Explanation

---

WHEREAS Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Society of South Australia Inc has agreed to effect a Public Liability insurance for certain Livestock Exhibitors at the 2010 Adelaide Show, the following applies:-

**Insured Party:** Livestock and Animal Exhibitors participating in competitions and events

**Period of Insurance:** From seven days prior to the Show until seven days thereafter

**Insured Activities:** All activities undertaken whilst within and from the confines of the event venue consistent with the Insured's livestock exhibit activity including setting up and removal

**Description of Cover:** Insurance in respect of the Insured Party's liability to pay costs and compensation in respect of loss of or damage to third party property and death of or injury to third party persons caused by and arising out of the Insured activities, all subject to the Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Society of South Australia Inc policy terms, conditions, exclusions and warranties, etc.

**Amount of Cover:** \$10,000,000 any one occurrence

**Deductible:** \$10,000 any one occurrence

**Geographic Limits:** At and from the event venue

**Claims Payable:** Worldwide excluding claims made USA and Canada

**Insurer(s):** Certain underwriters at Lloyds of London

**Address:** London Underwriting Centre, 3 Minster Court, Mincing Lane, London EC3R 7DD

**Policy Number:** 08GC0M0430

## Important Conditions:

1. The Insured Party must exercise reasonable care to maintain all premises, fittings and plant in sound condition.
2. The Insured Party must take all reasonable precautions to prevent injury and damage to persons and property.
3. The Insured Party must give immediate notice of an incident which may give rise to a claim or of receipt of advice of a claim.
4. The Insured Party must not make any admission, offer or promise in connection with any claim and must not any time admit liability.
5. The Insured Party must made themselves aware of and comply with the following Notices:-

**Duty of Disclosure:** Before you enter into a contract of General insurance with an insurer, you have a duty, under the Insurance Contracts Act 1984 as amended, to disclose to the insurer every matter that you know, or could reasonably be expected to know, is relevant to the insurer's decision whether to accept the risk of the insurance and, if so, on what terms.

You have the same duty to disclose these matters to the insurer before you renew, extend, vary or reinstate a contract of General insurance.

Your duty however, does not require disclosure of matter:-

- \* that diminishes the risk to be undertaken by the insurer
- \* that is of common knowledge
- \* that your insurer knows or, in the ordinary course of his business, ought to know.

**Non-Disclosure:** If you fail to comply with your duty of disclosure, the insurer may be entitled to reduce his liability under the contract in respect of a claim or may cancel the contract.

If your non-disclosure is fraudulent, the insurer may also have the option of avoiding the contract from its beginning.

**Average Provision:** The insurer will pay legal expenses in addition to the sum insured, if however, the total amount of the loss (less legal expenses) ultimately paid to the claimant(s) exceeds the sum insured then insurers will only pay (in addition to the sum insured) that proportion of the legal expenses as the sum insured bears to the loss.

**Third Party Interests:** This policy will only provide cover for your interest and does not cover the interests of any third party (e.g. financiers, lessors, etc) unless the interests of the third party are noted in the policy.

**Waiver of Insurer's Rights:** You must not enter into any agreement without the written authority of the insurer whereby any of their rights to which they become entitled as your insurer after settling or agreeing to settle a claim are prejudiced or limited in any way otherwise all benefit under the policy will be forfeited.
